



# ATTENTION VOTERS KNOW THE LAW



A registered voter may use this secure receptacle to deposit their absentee ballot or that of a close family member<sup>1</sup>.

Ohio law prohibits ballot harvesting. Anyone who possesses or delivers the absentee ballot of another person (unless a close family member), may be guilty of a Felony of the Fourth Degree, subject to a prison term of up to 18 months and/or a fine of up to \$5,000<sup>2</sup>.

This receptacle is kept under 24/7 video surveillance.



Ballots are retrieved at least daily by a team of trained, bipartisan election officials.



Once retrieved, ballots are securely stored in a dual-locked area that is under video surveillance and remain there until they are processed by a bipartisan team and counted on election night.
