Voter Frequently Asked Questions

When is Election Day?

Dates for 2024 Elections: (subject to additional special elections if required)

- May 6, 2025: Primary Election
- September 9, 2025: Municipal Primary Election
- November 4, 2025: General Election

What is on my ballot?

Voters may view a sample ballot at boe.cuyahogacounty.gov

How do I select my political party?

The voter will not select a political party when they register. Under Ohio election law, you declare your political affiliation by requesting the ballot of a political party in a partisan primary election. If you do not desire to affiliate with a political party in Ohio, you are an unaffiliated voter and may vote the Official Questions & Issues Ballot, if there is one for your precinct, at a primary election.

Can I register to vote online?

Yes, Ohioans may register to vote or update their voter registration online. A valid driver's license or state ID is required to use the online voter registration system. Visit voteohio.gov to register.

Where is my polling location?

Registered voters will receive a card in the mail with information about their voting location. Voters may look up their polling location at boe.cuyahogacounty.gov

What kind of ID do I have to bring with me on Election Day?

- An Ohio driver license
- An Ohio state ID card
- An interim identification form issued by the Bureau of Motor Vehicles
- A U.S. passport or passport card
- A U.S. military ID card, Ohio National Guard ID card, or U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs ID card (that includes the voter's name and photograph)

If a voter forgets to bring or does not have any ID, they will still be allowed to vote a provisional ballot which will be counted four days after Election Day.

Can someone under the age of 18 register to vote?

If a voter will be 18 years old on or before the next General Election, they may register to vote as a 17-year-old. You must be 18 years old to vote in a General Election, but you can vote in a Primary Election on candidates if you are 17 years old (and will be 18 by the next General Election).
