SUMMARY

- Advisory 2024-02 alerts boards of elections to temporary changes in the administration of the 2024 Presidential General Election due to the passage of H.B. 2 on May 31, 2024 (signed into law by Governor DeWine on June 2, 2024).
- The changes take effect on August 31, 2024 and include:
 - o Delayed certification of Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidates.
 - Certification transmission method.
 - o Delayed certification of forms for the 2024 Presidential General Election.
- These changes are temporary, and under continuing law for future presidential general elections, major political parties must certify the names of the presidential and vice-presidential candidates to the SOS for placement on the ballot on or before the 90th day before the day of the general election.

EXPLANATION

Delayed certification for Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidates

H.B. 2 delays the deadline for major political parties to certify presidential and vice-presidential candidates to the SOS for the 2024 Presidential General Election by moving the deadline from 90 days (August 7) before the day of the 2024 Presidential General Election to 65 days (September 1) beforehand.

Certification transmission method

H.B. 2 allows a political party to transmit the certification to the SOS by any reasonably reliable method that, under the circumstances, ensures the SOS will receive it by the deadline. These methods include:

- (a) Hand delivery;
- (b) Certified, express, or ordinary mail delivery by the United States Postal Service;
- (c) Commercial Carrier services;
- (d) Facsimile transmission; or
- (e) Electronic mail.

Delayed certification of forms for the 2024 General Election

H.B. 2 delays the deadline for the SOS to certify the forms of the official ballots to be used at the 2024 Presidential General Election from the 70th day (August 27) to not later than the 60th day (September 6) before the 2024 Presidential General Election.

To: All County Board of Elections

Directors, Deputy Directors, and Board Members

Re: H.B. 2, Presidential Candidates (135th General Assembly – Special Session)

BACKGROUND

The Ohio General Assembly passed House Bill 2 on May 31, 2024 in Special Session. Governor Mike DeWine signed the bill into law on June 2, 2024. This Advisory alerts boards of elections to temporary changes in the administration of the 2024 general election resulting from the passage of this legislation.

SUMMARY

The Act takes effect on August 31, 2024¹ and provides for the following temporary changes:

Delayed certification for Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidates

Delays the deadline for major political parties to certify presidential and vice-presidential candidates to the Secretary of State for the 2024 general election by moving the deadline from 90 days (August 7) before the day of the general election to 65 days (September 1) beforehand.

Certification transmission method

Allows a political party to transmit the certification to the Secretary of State by any reasonably reliable method that, under the circumstances, ensures the Secretary of State will receive it by the deadline.

Delayed certification of forms for the 2024 general

Delays the deadline for the Secretary of State to certify the forms of the official ballots to be used at the 2024 general election from the 70th day (August 27) to not later than the 60th day (September 6) before the 2024 general election.

EXPLANATION

Delayed certification of Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidates and forms for 2024

The act delays the deadline for major political parties to certify presidential and vice-presidential candidates to the Secretary of State for the 2024 general election (from 90 days to 65 days prior). This is a temporary provision that applies only to 2024. Under continuing law, for future presidential general elections, major political parties must certify the names of the presidential and

vice-presidential candidates to the Secretary of State for placement on the ballot on or before the 90th day before the day of the general election.²

The act also provides that a political party may transmit the certification to the Secretary of State by any reasonably reliable method ensuring delivery by the deadline, including:

- (a) Hand delivery;
- (b) Certified, express, or ordinary mail delivery by the United States Postal Service;
- (c) Commercial Carrier services;

- (d) Facsimile transmission; or
- (e) Electronic mail.

Additionally, the act delays the deadline by which the Secretary of State is required to certify to the boards of elections the forms of the official ballots to be used for the 2024 general election (from 70 days to not later than 60 days prior). This provision applies only to the 2024 general election. Under continuing law, for future presidential general elections, the Secretary must certify the forms of the official ballots to be used at a general election on the 70th day before a general election in future years.³



SUMMARY FOR KJERSTINE POPOV CHALLENGE:

On May 23, 2024, Kjerstine J. Popov, a registered voter in North Royalton, Ward 4-C, submitted an SOS prescribed Form #257, Challenge of Right to Vote and Correction of Registration List that challenges the right of Wurood Aimen Saleh to vote using the address of 4805 Royalwood Road in North Royalton.

General Information

- Kjerstine Popov indicates on the Challenge Form that Wurood Saleh has never lived at the 4805 Royalwood Road address.
- There are three people currently registered at 4805 Royalwood Road: Kjerstine Popov, Peter Popov, and Wurood Aimen Saleh.
- Per the Cuyahoga County Property Summary Report, Kjerstine and Peter Popov have been owners of the property at 4805 Royalwood Road since September 30, 2019.

Kjerstine Popov Information

- Kjerstine Popov has been registered in the voter registration database at the 4805 Royalwood Road address since November 3, 2015.
- Kjerstine Popov has voted consistently at the 4805 Royalwood Road address since the November 2015 General Election.



New Business



What is New in the 2024 General Election CCBOE EAP

General

- Polling locations used for the EAP are the locations for the November 5, 2024 Presidential General Election.
- All election dates were changed from March 19, 2024 Primary Election to November 5, 2024 Presidential General Election.

I. Precinct Election Official Recruitment, Training, and Accountability

- Referenced that Open House sessions are offered throughout the county for poll workers to utilize the training equipment without the typical classroom time restrictions.
- Noted that regardless of whether the SOS issues a Directive (this typically happens in the summer) requiring all poll workers to train before the November 5, 2024 Presidential General Election, the CCBOE will require all poll workers, regardless of experience, to train in some capacity.

II. Resource Allocation

- Noted the number of zone stations utilized for the election has been reduced from seven (7) to six (6).
- Updated the anticipated dates of board meetings to authorize the allocation of voting equipment, voting booths, etc.
- Updated the anticipated dates of board meetings to authorize the paper ballot allocation.
- Updated the "Draft plan for resource allocation" to reflect November 5, 2024 Presidential General Election resources. This includes updating the Election Day Ballot Order. As a general rule, the CCBOE will order 115% of the total number of registered voters per precinct.

III. Pre-Election Day and Election Day Communication Plan

- Provided updated contacts for key Cuyahoga County contacts (IT, Public Works, USPS, etc.), along with police and fire chiefs of every county municipality.
- Outlined our Call Tree for distributing mass communication to full-time employees and included a screenshot of its structure (minus phone numbers).

- Included templates for CCBOE press releases, social media posts, and pre-scripted rapid response messages. This was a new addition by the SOS.
- Outlined various methods to ensure communication is maintained with polling locations, emergency services, and the public during a potential telephone disruption. This includes submitting BOE issued cell phones from each polling location, and many cell phone numbers of full-time staff, to a service (First Net or Wireless Priority Service) that, if an event occurs that impacts cellular service, these cell numbers will be given the highest priority to still maintain cellular service.

IV. Materials

- Section on low ballot supply was updated to reflect the new CCBOE tracking and ballot-ondemand system that was used (successfully) starting with the March 19, 2024 Presidential Primary Election.
- The Master List of Supplies was updated to reflect November 5, 2024 Presidential General Election supplies.

V. Contingency and Continuity Planning

- The SOS added one (1) new section (Alternate polling location or combined polling location plans) and two (2) new subsections to Potential Voting Disruption (Line management and Political attire / apparel).
 - The CCBOE already had plans for moving a polling location within 72 hours of Election Day, and Election Day itself, in its EAP, so referenced this existing content.
 Also add a few additional points provided by Election Support.
 - Each polling location has a Greeter, and part of that position is to monitor the line of voters. The EAP details the plan to manage a line of voters if it goes beyond what the Greeter can handle.
 - For poll workers, the CCBOE has a professionalism training module that addresses the proper way to resolve a situation with political attire/apparel.
 - At the polling locations, there is signage posted at the entrance to each location which references R.C. 3501.35 ("Remove all political advertisements before entering the polling location.").

VI. Security

• No significant changes were made to the Security section.

VII. Voter Registration

No significant changes were made to the Registration section.

VIII. Absentee Ballots

- Expected VBM application volume (and returned VBM ballots) will be based upon the total ballots cast (631,199) in the November 3, 2020 Presidential General Election. This gives us an expectation of around 300,000 VBM applications, and somewhere between 250,000 and 275,000 returned VBM ballots.
- Cost of VBM ballot packs updated to reflect both the volume of requests, but also a slight increase in postage cost which begins in July.

IX. Polling Locations and Accessibility

• No significant changes were made to the Polling Locations and Accessibility section.

X. Ballot Preparation

No significant changes were made to the Ballot Preparation section.

XI. Pre-Election Testing

No significant changes were made to the Pre-Election Testing section.
