

## **VOTE-BY-MAIL/EARLY IN-PERSON SUMMARY**






## PROVISIONAL VOTING SUMMARY

### **CITY OF MAYFIELD HEIGHTS**

ARTICLE IV
THE COUNCIL

### SECTION 1. COMPOSITION AND TERM.

The Council shall consist of seven (7) members, elected at large for a term of four (4) years and until their successors are elected and qualified, beginning on the first day of January next following their election; except that of the seven (7) members elected at the regular Municipal election in 1951, the three (3) receiving the highest number of votes shall serve for four (4) years and the remaining four (4) shall each serve for two (2) years.

No person shall hold the office of Council for longer than three (3) successive four (4) year terms, commencing the first day of January next after the regular Municipal election in 1995. This shall include terms served by persons before and after such election.

(11-5-91)

### SECTION 2. ORGANIZATION.

In January 1952, and each second year thereafter, Council shall meet at the Council Chamber and organize. At such organization meeting, or as soon as practicable thereafter, Council shall elect one Councilman as President of Council for a two-year term, who shall preside at the meetings of Council and perform such duties as Presiding Officer as may be imposed on him or her by the Council, and who shall also perform such other duties as are provided for him or her by this Charter. At such organization meeting the Council shall elect such other members of Council as are required by the provisions of this Charter to serve on other bodies, boards or commissions.

### SECTION 3. VACANCIES IN THE COUNCIL.

Whenever the office of a Councilman shall become vacant, the vacancy shall be filled by a majority vote of all the remaining members of Council, and if the vacancy shall not be filled within forty-five (45) days, the Mayor shall fill it by appointment. Each Councilman so elected or appointed shall have been a resident of the City of Mayfield Heights for at least three (3) years immediately preceding his or her appointment or election and shall hold office for the balance of the unexpired term or until the beginning of the term of a successor elected for the unexpired term as hereinafter provided. A successor shall be elected for the unexpired term at the next Municipal election if (a) such election shall occur more than two (2) years prior to the expiration of the unexpired term, and (b) the vacancy shall have occurred more than ninety (90) days prior to such election. The term of no Councilman

shall be lengthened by his or her resignation and subsequent appointment, but any appointee may be a candidate for subsequent election. (11-7-89; 11-3-92)

### **SECTION 4. MEETINGS.**

- (a) All Council meetings shall be held in the Municipal Building of the City of Mayfield Heights. A majority of the members of the Council shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Council, but a lesser number may recess the meeting from time to time and compel the attendance of absent members; and at any meeting at which a quorum is present, any ordinance or resolution may be passed or adopted or other action taken by the affirmative vote of four (4) members of the Council, unless a larger number be required by the provisions of this Charter or by the laws of Ohio. The Clerk of Council shall keep a record of its proceedings in a journal in which the yea or nay vote of each Councilman voting on an ordinance shall be entered. The Council's journal shall be made available to the public and all meetings of the Council shall be open to the public unless a private executive session is called pursuant to the Ohio Revised Code. (11-8-88)
- (b) Special meetings may be called by vote of the Council taken at any regular or special meeting of the Council or shall be called by the Clerk of Council or one acting as Clerk of Council upon the written request of the Mayor, President of Council, or three members of the Council. Any such vote or request shall state the subject or subjects to be considered in the meeting and no other subject shall be considered. Notice in writing of such special meeting called by the Mayor, President of the Council, or three (3) members of the Council, must be given to each member of the Council and the Mayor by service personally upon him, or left at his or her usual place of residence.

(11-8-60)

### SECTION 5. GENERAL ORDINANCES.

The Council shall by ordinance make provision for:

- (a) The time of regular meetings of the Council.
- (b) The method of giving public notice of the enactment of its ordinances and adoption of its resolutions and of any other of its acts or proceedings which it deems proper to publish, provided, however, that until so provided for, such public notice shall be in the manner provided by the statutes of the State of Ohio.
- (c) The advertising and awarding of contracts, provided that no expenditure of more than fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000), or such other sum as established from time to time by the statutes of the State of Ohio, pertaining to the maximum expenditure permitted by a city without competitive bidding, except for the acquisition of real estate, for the discharge of non-contractual claims against the City, for personal services, for the joint use of facilities or exercise of powers with other political subdivisions, or for the product or services of

public utilities, including those Municipally operated, shall be made except pursuant to contract made with the lowest and best bidder after public advertising and receipt of bids in the manner provided by ordinance, and provided further that no contract in excess of fifty percent (50%) of the sum required for competitive bidding, as set forth hereinabove, shall be made without approval of Council.

- (d) The procedure for making public improvements and levying assessments expeditiously, including the procedure for combining two or more public improvements and the levying of assessments therefor in one proceeding, and if the Council finds that it would be economical and practical to undertake such improvements promptly.
- (e) Such other general regulations as the Council may deem necessary, including regulations as to the custody and use by the Clerk of Council of an official seal.

(11-3-81; 11-7-89; 11-3-98)

# SECTION 6. ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

- (a) All legislative action of the Council shall be by ordinance or resolution, and all ordinances and resolutions shall be introduced, adopted, rejected or amended in the manner provided for by the laws of the State of Ohio, except as otherwise provided in this Charter.
- (b) Each ordinance providing for the appropriation of money or for an annual tax levy or for improvements petitioned for by the owners of a majority of the front footage of the property benefited and to be specially assessed therefor, and any emergency ordinance or resolution necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety, shall take effect, unless a later time be specified therein, upon its signature by the Mayor, or upon expiration of the time within which it may be disapproved by the Mayor, or upon its passage after the disapproval by the Mayor, as the case may be. Each other ordinance or resolution shall go into effect thirty (30) days after its passage by the Council, except as otherwise provided in this Charter. Each emergency measure shall contain a statement of the necessity for such emergency action and shall require the affirmative votes of at least five (5) members of the Council for its enactment. No action of the Council in authorizing any change in the boundaries of the City or the surrender or joint exercise of any of its powers, or in granting any franchise, or in contracting for the supply to the City or its inhabitants of the product or service of any utility, whether Municipally owned or not, shall be taken as an emergency measure.

### SECTION 7. POWERS OF COUNCIL.

All the legislative powers of the City of Mayfield Heights and all other powers as may be granted by this Charter, together with all such powers as are now or may hereafter be granted by the laws of Ohio to boards of control, municipal taxing commissions, boards of

health or any other municipal commission, board or body now or hereafter created, shall be vested in the Council, except as otherwise provided in this Charter.

### SECTION 8. SALARIES AND BONDS.

Council shall fix the salary or compensation of each officer, employee or member of any board or commission of the City. Any such person may be required by the Council from time to time to furnish a bond or bonds for the faithful performance of his or her duties. and the Council may provide that the premium for any such bond shall be paid by the City. The compensation of the Mayor and of each member of the Council shall be fixed at least thirty (30) days before the time for filing nominating petitions for the terms beginning on the next succeeding first day of January, and shall not thereafter be changed in respect to any such terms or any part thereof, except that the compensation of members of Council for the unexpired portion of their four-year terms shall be changed to correspond to the compensation fixed for members of Council commencing new four-year terms, so that a uniform rate of compensation will be paid to all members of Council. The compensation of the three (3) members of Council whose terms of office expire December 31, 1971, shall be changed, effective June 1, 1970, to correspond to the compensation of the members of Council whose terms of office commenced on January 1, 1970. The compensation of each other officer, employee, and member of a board or commission of the City shall be fixed by the Council, and, subject to the power of the Council to provide otherwise by ordinance or resolution, may be changed at any time at its discretion. Council may authorize the payment or reimbursement of expenses incurred by any officer or employee of the City or by any member of any board or commission of the City in trips taken in the interest of the City.
