The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Meeting began at 9:30 a.m. Hereinafter referred to as the CCBOE/Board.

Chairman Hastings noted that Board Members Davis Chappell and Stickan were in attendance. Board Member Wondolowski was excused from today's meeting.

Chairman Hastings moved to excuse Board member Wondolowski's absence. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Chairman Hastings moved to approve the minutes from the January 11, 2022, and January 25, 2022, Board Meetings. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 3: Approval to outsource the printing and mailing of Vote-by-Mail ballots for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election

Chairman Hastings moved to approve to outsource the printing and mailing of Vote-by-Mail ballots for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 4: Hearing on the petitions received 2/1/2022 for the recall of the Mayor of Newburgh Heights

Chairman Hastings stated the petitioners had filed with the CCBOE a recall petition for the Mayor of the Village of Newburgh Heights. Brent Lawler, Candidate and Petition Services Manager, along with the Director and Deputy Director, had reached out to Luke McConville, Newburgh Heights Law Director, and inquired if state law permitted the recall petition to be certified for the ballot. The Law Director issued an opinion stating the recall petitions should not be certified to the ballot because the Charter for the Village of Newburgh Heights does not permit a recall election for the Mayor of the Village of Newburgh Heights. The petitioners hired Attorney Donald Brey, who wrote to Assistant Prosecutor Musson and the CCBOE stating the recall should be certified to the ballot. Chairman Hastings noted this matter is akin to a summary judgment motion. There are no facts in dispute and the Board's decision comes down to a matter of law. After hearing from the attorneys for the recall petitioners, the Village of Newburg and the Board's attorney Assistant Prosecutor Musson, Chairman Hastings moved to not certify the petitions received on 2/1/2022 for the recall of the Mayor of Newburgh Heights. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 5: Acknowledgment of resignations from and appointments to elected office

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the resignations from and appointments to elected office as provided in the meeting materials. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 6: Acknowledgment of intent to retire from elected office

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the intent to retire from elected office as provided in the meeting materials. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 7: Acknowledgment of withdrawal of candidates and issue from the May 3, 2022, Primary Election

Brent Lawler, Candidate and Petition Services Manager, presented information from the board packet concerning the withdrawal of an issue and candidates from the May 3, 2022, Primary Election.

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the withdrawal of candidates and issue from the May 3, 2022, Primary Election as provided in the meeting materials. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 8: Certification of candidates and issues for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election

Prior to the certification of candidates and issues for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election, two candidates requested a Board Review of their petitions.

Brent Lawler, Candidate and Petition Services Manager, presented information from the board packet regarding Shayla L. Davis, Democratic County Central Committee Garfield Heights Ward 4 Precinct C. The petition required five valid signatures, six signatures were filed, four were deemed valid, and two were deemed not genuine by CCBOE staff. Shayla L. Davis addressed the Board regarding insufficient signatures on the petition. Ms. Davis provided a notarized affidavit from petition signatory Shy'aira Lashay Davis clarifying the printing of the name versus the required signature. Chairman Hastings asked Ms. Davis if she saw the signature cards of the signatories in question. Ms. Davis stated yes. Chairman Hastings asked Ms. Davis if she agreed the petition signature for Anthony B. Gamble III did not match the signature card. Ms. Davis said correct. Board Member Davis Chappell asked Ms. Davis if she agreed that Shy'aira Lashay Davis did print her name. The printed signature looks different from the provisional envelope signature the CCBOE has on file. Ms. Davis stated the signature does look different. However, the printed version matches her signature, and Shy'aira Lashay Davis printed her name to clarify the spelling and was not aware that printing the name was unacceptable. Chairman Hastings stated the CCBOE staff properly brought this discrepancy to the Board's attention, however in light of the letter from Shy'aira Lashay Davis and Ms. Davis's testimony under oath Chairman Hastings moved to have Shayla L. Davis certified to the Democratic County Central Committee Garfield Heights, Ward 4, Precinct C, May 3, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Brent Lawler, Candidate and Petition Services Manager, presented information from the board packet regarding William Yeung, Democratic County Central Committee, Lakewood Ward 2, Precinct G. The issue which required Board review is Mr. Yeung will not be 18 years of age on the date of the May 3, 2022 and turns 18 years on May 26, 2022. As with State Central Committee candidates, Central Committee candidates are also elected at the May Primary; the positions are not nominated. The CCBOE staff has conferred with Assistant Prosecutor Musson, who concurs that Mr. Yeung's age disqualifies him from continuing as a qualified elector. The ORC Section 3517.02 on the Controlling Committees state that members shall be a resident and qualified elector of the district, and the election manuals state that candidates that are 17 years old could only vote on candidates seeking the election of nomination, they cannot vote on County Central, State Central or Issues so he would not be able to vote for himself. Mr. Yeung addressed the Board Members remotely regarding the interpretation of being a qualified elector. Chairman Hastings asked Assistant Prosecutor Musson to opine on this matter. Assistant Prosecutor Musson stated the CCBOE Board is bound by the Ohio Elections Official Manual and the Directives of the Ohio Secretary of State which holds that a 17-year-old is ineligible to vote for elections at the Primary. Seventeen-year-olds can nominate candidates for the general election, but the actual election of individuals at the primary election is not something a 17-year-old can vote on. Board Member Davis Chappell asked how there is a distinction in the interpretation between voting and running for election. Mr. Musson stated that to run as a Central Committee person, an individual must be 18 years old at the time of the election. Ms. Amelia Yeung, a parent of William Yeung, asked if the May 3, 2022, Primary Election is moved, how would the change in the Election date impact the age qualification for William Yeung. Chairman Hastings stated the CCBOE is currently required to certify Central Committee candidates by 4:00 p.m. on February 14, 2022, so a change in the primary date does not make her son eligible to run for Central Committee regardless of when the 2022 primary is held.

Chairman Hastings moved not to certify William Yeung to the Democratic County Central Committee, Lakewood Ward 2, Precinct G, May 3, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Brent Lawler, Candidate and Petition Services Manager, presented information from the board packet of candidates not to certify for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election.

Chairman Hastings moved not to certify the individuals listed on the Petitions for Board Review, beginning with Luis R. Vizcarrondao, Jr. thru Gretchen Herzberger as listed in the board meeting materials for the reasons set forth in the agenda. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Brent Lawler, Candidate and Petition Services Manager, presented information from the board packet of candidates and issues to be certified for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election.

As provided in the meeting materials, Chairman Hastings moved to certify the candidates and issues for the May 3, 2022, Primary Election. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 9: Acknowledgment of the PEO Performance Report

Marlene Robinson Statler, Election Officials Assistant Manager, presented information from the board packet concerning the Precinct Election Official (PEO) Performance Report.

Chairman Hastings moved to acknowledge the PEO Performance Report. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 10: Approval to Renew the Delivery & Return of Voting Equipment to Voting Locations Contract with Midfitz, Inc. dba Berman Moving & Storage, under subdivision (B) Article I., in the amount not-to-exceed \$51,463.50 for the First Renewal Period May 3, 2022, through November 2, 2022

Kendra Zusy, Fiscal Service Manager, presented information from the board packet regarding the approval to renew the Delivery & Return of Voting Equipment to Voting Locations Contract with Midfitz, Inc. dba Berman Moving & Storage. Board Member Davis Chappell asked how any changes to the Primary Election would affect what the Board is acting on today. Ms. Zusy stated that the contract covers the period from May 3, 2022, to November 2, 2022. The moving expense for any additional elections occurring in this time period are included. Director Perlatti stated if there were two primary elections, the CCBOE does not have the money encumbered, but the CCBOE does have the rate structure based on location delivery. Either the State would provide the funding, or the CCBOE would go to the County and ask for the additional funds for a second Primary Election.

Chairman Hastings moved to approve to renew the Delivery & Return of Voting Equipment to Voting Locations Contract with Midfitz, Inc. dba Berman Moving & Storage, under subdivision (B) Article I., in the amount not-to-exceed \$51,463.50 for the First Renewal Period May 3, 2022, through November 2, 2022. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Board Member Davis Chappell recused herself from approving an internal voucher less than \$25,000 to the Academy of Continuing Legal Education for \$235.00 listed on the January 17, 2022, Voucher Summary.

Agenda Item 11: Approval to Suspend Contract (CM1356) with Tenex Software Solutions providing Online Poll Worker Management Solution Software, Election Force, Under the Authority of Subdivision (I)(3), Article IV. of the Contract

Director Perlatti stated the CCBOE has utilized Tenex Software Solutions Online Poll Worker Management Solutions, Election Force for online poll worker management. The Tenex software was used to collect information for poll worker applications, CCBOE staff also used it to assign poll workers to a polling locations and sign-up for training classes. The product was first used in the November 2020 Election when the Secretary of State allowed online training due to the pandemic. The product worked in 2020 but presented challenges. The CCBOE advised Tenex on what needed to be improved. In 2021, CCBOE staff worked with Tenex to implement an update, and there was some improvement. Tenex then came out with another update before the August 2021 Election, however, because of the proximity of that release and the August election those changes were not implemented during that election cycle. In the Fall of 2021, the CCBOE had four elections. The most significant issues the CCBOE experienced with the software were the speed and the versatility of tracking poll workers. CCBOE staff had weekly calls with Tenex to review the software issues.

Tenex issued another software release in December 2021, CCBOE staff reviewed this update in the test server, and significant performance issues still existed. Tenex were then informed that the Director and Deputy Director would be recommending that the CCBOE suspend the use of the Tenex Online Poll Worker Management Solution Software, Election Force, as the product does not perform to CCBOE standards. Tenex agreed with some of the issues that exist and mutually agreed that the CCBOE will not be using this product. The CCBOE has a plan going forward to replace the software by using DIMS, the voter registration database, MAC software product, and email communications using Constant Contact. The CCBOE will continue using Tenex University, the online poll worker training portal, and CCBOE staff is working with Tenex and Force regarding the necessary credentials. Chairman Hastings stated this is a mutual agreement, and the CCBOE has a plan to replace the Election Force functionalities. Director Perlatti stated yes. Chairman Hastings asked if there is a plan to regroup with Tenex in six months to review its software improvements. Director Perlatti stated Tenex would keep the testing portal open as modifications are made. The CCBOE will continue to test the modifications, and after the Primary Election, the CCBOE will meet with Tenex regarding the Online Poll Worker Management Software. Board Member Davis Chappell stated that there are service level guarantees and warranties under the contract and inquired if there will be a credit to the CCBOE for the performance issues in 2021. Board Member Davis Chappell would like legal counsel to review the contract and advise the Board.

Chairman Hastings moved to approve to suspend the contract (CM1356) with Tenex Software Solutions providing Online Poll Worker Management Solution Software, Election Force, Under the Authority of Subdivision (I)(3), Article IV. of the Contract. Board Member Stickman seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 12: Challenge of right to vote filed by Delores Gray against Richard Starr

Betty Edwards, Registration Department Manager, provided information from the board packet regarding the challenge of the right to vote filed by Delores Gray against Richard Starr. On January 12, 2022, the CCBOE received Secretary of State Form 257 Challenge of Right to Vote from Delores Gray, challenging Richard Starr's voter registration address. In addition to the written submissions by the parties, the Board took testimony from both Ms. Gray and Mr. Starr who was accompanied by his attorney. At the conclusion of the hearing Board Member Davis Chappell moved to reject the Challenge of Right to Vote filed by Delores Gray against Richard Starr. Chairman Hastings seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

Agenda Item 13: Approval of the personnel agenda

Chairman Hastings moved to approve the personnel agenda. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

Director Perlatti stated the Election Officials department is reformatting the training manual for poll workers based on input from focus groups. Also, letters have been mailed to people who have previously served as poll workers to update their contact information. The CCBOE has also worked

on incentivizing workers to complete the training. County Council approved an increase of the poll worker stipend. The pay will be increased (with incentives) from the old rate of \$172.00 to \$220.00. Individuals who complete the training within the first two weeks will be paid an additional \$30.00 training bonus. Training between weeks three and four will pay a bonus of \$15.00. By incentivizing individuals, the CCBOE can determine what works and adjust recruitment efforts accordingly. Additionally, an application has been submitted to the Ohio Supreme Court for Continuing Legal Education (CLE) credits. The CCBOE is also working on a continuing education credits program for social workers. Deputy Director Kaloger is working on recruitment efforts to increase the participation of Republican poll workers.

Director Perlatti stated that today's Berman's six-month contract extension, ends just before the November 8, 2022, General Election. There is language in the contract that the contract can be extended by mutual agreement of the parties. He indicated staff would like to extend the contract with Berman's until the end of 2022. In 2023, new bid specifications will be published based on the CCBOE's new voting equipment. Chairman Hastings clarified that if the CCBOE does enter into negotiations with Berman's and the parties come to an agreement that they believe is fair and reasonable, that agreement would be submitted to the Board for approval. Assistant Prosecutor Musson stated yes.

Director Perlatti stated that the CCBOE would be posting job openings in the next two weeks. Also, the CCBOE did receive notice of intent to depart from Mary Hannah Boyer, Database Analyst, as she is relocating. The CCBOE will be posting the IT position now since it can be challenging to fill. There are also reposting for Elections Officials in the Ballot Department, Campaign Finance Auditor, and Fiscal Officer positions. The Election Officials Recruiter position did receive approximately 25 applications, and Human Resources will identify applicants to proceed with an interview and assessment process. Job opportunities are being posted on the CCBOE and County websites, Indeed, social media, and sent to the major political parties. Human Resources is also reformatting the job postings to make the content more user-friendly.

There was no public comment

Chairman Hastings moved to adjourn the meeting at 11:46 a.m. Board Member Davis Chappell seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

SUMMARY

- *Directive 2022-23* requires the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) to provide a list of registrations in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2018 NCOA and Supplemental Process.
- The four-year period that precedes cancellation pursuant to the 2018 NCOA and Supplemental Process began when the confirmation notices were mailed in 2018.
- No voter registrations will be cancelled before the 2022 Primary Election resulting from this general voter records maintenance program.
- This Directive requires the CCBOE to send a registration readiness notice (Form 255-A-3) to each registration that is in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2018 NCOA and Supplemental Process.

I. REGISTRATION READINESS NOTICES PURSUANT TO 2018 NCOA AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS

Before mailing registration readiness notices, the CCBOE must submit a "registration readiness file" to the Secretary of State's Office (SOS). The CCBOE must process any outstanding voter registration transactions (*by the close of business on Feb. 16, 2022*) and timely resolve duplicates (*by the close of business on Feb. 18, 2022*) before submitting the registration readiness file (*which must be sent on Feb. 22, 2022*).

The SOS will review the CCBOE's data. If the review is satisfactory, the SOS will authorize the CCBOE to mail registration readiness notices. The notices must be mailed by **March 8, 2022**.

II. CANCELLATIONS PURSUANT TO THE 2018 NCOA PROCESS

The CCBOE is prohibited from cancelling any voter registration pursuant to the 2018 NCOA process **prior** to the 2022 Primary Election. The following instructions are for the period **after** the 2022 Primary Election.

A. PRE-CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2018 NCOA PROCESS RECORDS

Before completing any cancellations pursuant to the 2018 NCOA process, the CCBOE must submit a "pre-cancellation file" to the SOS. Prior to providing the pre-cancellation file, the CCBOE must process all outstanding voter registration transactions (*by the close of business on June 8, 2022*) and timely resolve duplicate registrations (*by the close of business on June 10, 2022*) before submitting the pre-cancellation file (*which must be sent on June 13, 2022*).

B. CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2018 NCOA PROCESS RECORDS

The SOS will review the list of voter registration records pending cancellation. If the review is satisfactory, the SOS will authorize the CCBOE to proceed with cancelling the registrations. All identified records must

be cancelled by **July 1, 2022** (exceptions to records that will be cancelled are detailed in this Directive). On **July 5, 2022**, the CCBOE must send the SOS the spreadsheet containing registrations that were cancelled.

III. CANCELLATIONS PURSUANT TO THE 2018 SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS

The CCBOE is prohibited from cancelling any voter registration pursuant to the 2018 Supplemental process **prior** to the 2022 Primary Election. The following instructions are for the period **after** the 2022 Primary Election.

A. PRE-CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2018 SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS RECORDS

Before completing any cancellations pursuant to the 2018 Supplemental process, the CCBOE must submit a “pre-cancellation file” to the SOS. Prior to providing the pre-cancellation file, the CCBOE must process all outstanding voter registration transactions (*by the close of business on July 6, 2022*) and timely resolve duplicate registrations (*by the close of business on July 8, 2022*) before submitting the pre-cancellation file (*which must be sent on July 11, 2022*).

B. CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2018 SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS RECORDS

The SOS will review the list of voter registration records pending cancellation. If the review is satisfactory, the SOS will authorize the CCBOE to proceed with cancelling the registrations. All identified records must be cancelled by **August 8, 2022** (exceptions to records that will be cancelled are detailed in this Directive). On **August 9, 2022**, the CCBOE must send the SOS the spreadsheet containing registrations that were cancelled.

C. APRI EXCEPTION: RECORDS PERTAINING TO THE 2018 SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS

For the 2022 November General Election, a provisional ballot cast during the early in-person absentee voting period or on Election Day by a voter who is not registered to vote may be counted if all the following apply (the “APRI Exception”):

1. The individual’s voter registration was cancelled in 2022 (confirmation notice mailed in 2018) pursuant to the Supplemental Process;
2. The voter’s provisional ballot affirmation reflects an address within the precinct in which the voter currently resides, and the voter was previously registered to vote within that same county prior to cancellation;
3. The CCBOE does not have information that the voter was deceased, incarcerated on a felony conviction, or adjudicated as incompetent under Ohio law by a county probate court after the individual’s registration record was cancelled; and
4. The voter’s provisional ballot affirmation form and the ballot otherwise comply with all applicable laws and directives.

IV. MAINTAINING RECORDS OF CANCELLATION

The CCBOE must work with DIMS to ensure it maintains and can produce a list of voter registrations cancelled pursuant to this Directive.

To: All County Boards of Elections
Board Members, Directors, and Deputy Directors

Re: Data Collection, Notice, and Cancellation Procedures for Completion of 2018 National Change of Address ("NCOA") and Supplemental Process

BACKGROUND

In 2018, the General Voter Records Maintenance National Change of Address ("NCOA") and Supplemental Processes occurred at different times in that year. [Directive 2018-04](#) instructed all boards of elections to mail confirmation notices to electors identified pursuant to the 2018 NCOA Process between February 20, 2018 and March 7, 2018. [Directive 2018-20](#) instructed all boards of elections to mail confirmation notices to electors identified pursuant to the 2018 Supplemental Process no later than August 6, 2018. The four-year period that precedes cancellation pursuant to the 2018 NCOA and Supplemental Process began when the confirmation notices were mailed in 2018.

State and federal law require maintaining accurate voter registration records. The Secretary of State's Office is committed to encouraging all eligible voters to engage in voter-initiated activity or voting, including responding to the notices and identifying and rectifying data discrepancies. Therefore, this Directive requires each county board of elections to provide a list of registrations in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2018 NCOA and Supplemental Process to the Secretary of State's Office. The Secretary of State's Office will publish the list of registrations in active-confirmation status to encourage a response to the notices that will be sent to registrations on the list.

No voter registrations will be cancelled before the 2022 Primary Election as a result of the state's general voter records maintenance program. This Directive requires the boards of elections to send a registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 2/2022](#)) to each registration that is in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2018 NCOA and Supplemental Process.

After the 2022 Primary Election and per the timelines set forth in this Directive, boards must provide a pre-cancellation list, but only after (1) uploading all voter history from the primary election and (2) processing voter registration transactions pending after the election. Cancellations will occur in two phases as outlined in the instructions below.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. REGISTRATION READINESS NOTICES PURSUANT TO 2018 NCOA AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS

Before mailing registration readiness notices, boards must submit a "registration readiness file" to the Secretary of State's Office. Boards must process any outstanding voter registration transactions and timely resolve duplicates before submitting the registration readiness file. Prior

to submitting the registration readiness file to the Secretary of State's Office, each board of elections must complete the following steps:

1. Receive from all designated agencies and process all outstanding voter registration transactions by the close of business on **February 16, 2022**.¹
2. Resolve all outstanding duplicate registrations by the close of business on **February 18, 2022**.

This timeline must be followed to ensure that each board resolves duplicate registrations without being impacted by another board's processing of voter registration transactions. No earlier than **February 25, 2022**, boards may resume processing voter registration transactions received after **February 16, 2022**.

On the day shown below, boards of elections must upload the spreadsheet containing the registration records that will receive the registration readiness notice:

- **February 22, 2022:** Adams through Guernsey
- **February 23, 2022:** Hamilton through Muskingum
- **February 24, 2022:** Noble through Wyandot

Note that every record on the spreadsheet must receive a registration readiness notice, unless there is voter-initiated activity prior to the notice being mailed.

All boards must utilize the same spreadsheet format, containing the following information:

- County Number
- County Name
- State Voter ID
- Cancel Reason (NCOA or Supplemental)
- Registration Date
- Last Voted Date
- First Name
- Last Name
- Address
- Address 2
- City
- State
- Zip Code
- Voter Status
- Confirmation Notice Mail Date

The spreadsheet must be uploaded to the board's SharePoint folder in a .csv format. Each record provided in the spreadsheet must meet the following data conditions:

- If the record is in active-confirmation status as a result of the **2018 NCOA Process**:

- The record must be contained on the 2018 Out-of-County NCOA list;
 - The Out-of-County Confirmation Notice must have been mailed no later than March 7, 2018;
 - There must be no voter history on or after May 8, 2018;
 - The registration date is before February 20, 2018;
 - The record does not contain any voter-initiated activity between the date the confirmation notice was mailed and the date the data is compiled for the mailing of the registration readiness notice. Voter-initiated activity includes voting, submitting a valid absentee ballot application, registering to vote, updating or confirming an address with a board of elections or the BMV, or signing a candidate or issue petition that is verified by a board of elections²; and
 - The record does not appear on the “Do Not Cancel” list accompanying this Directive.
- If the record is in active-confirmation status as a result of the **2018 Supplemental Process**:
 - The confirmation notice must have been mailed no later than August 6, 2018;
 - There must be no voter history on and after the March 15, 2016 Primary Election;
 - The registration date must be before the March 15, 2016 Primary Election;
 - The record does not contain any voter-initiated activity to the record between the date the confirmation notice was mailed and the date the data is compiled for the mailing of the registration readiness notice; and
 - The record does not appear on the “Do Not Cancel” list accompanying this Directive.

The Secretary of State’s staff will review each board’s data. If the review is satisfactory, the Secretary of State’s Office will email each board to authorize the board to mail registration readiness notices.

Boards of elections must send, by forwardable mail, the registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 2/2022](#)) to each registration that meets the criteria above. Each board must finish mailing the notices by **March 8, 2022**. The notice must be populated with the recipient’s name and address. If the elector replies to the notice by updating or confirming the elector’s address at any time prior to the anticipated cancellation date, the elector’s registration must not be cancelled. Each board utilizing a vendor to print the notices must inform the vendor of the timeframe associated with this mailing to ensure the deadline is achieved. The board must review and follow the outsourcing required mailings section in [Chapter 2 of the Election Official Manual](#).

Boards must include a courtesy reply mail return envelope with each notice. As a reminder, each board must incorporate the use of the Official Election Mail logo on both outbound and inbound envelopes used with the registration readiness notices. Each board should consult with its

Election Mail Coordinator for assistance in preparing for this mailing. Boards must ensure proper quality control is performed to ensure the registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 2/2022](#)) and the courtesy reply mail return envelope is properly printed and included in the outbound mailing envelope. This mailing should be organized in a fashion that maximizes the recipients' desire to read the contents.

Counties are eligible for reimbursement of actual costs for printing and mailing registration readiness notices sent pursuant to this Directive. Information regarding reimbursement procedures is forthcoming.

II. CANCELLATIONS PURSUANT TO THE 2018 NCOA PROCESS

Boards of elections are prohibited from cancelling any voter registration pursuant to the 2018 NCOA Process prior to the 2022 Primary Election. The following instructions are for the period after the 2022 Primary Election, preceding any cancellation.

A. PRE-CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2018 NCOA PROCESS RECORDS

Before completing any cancellations pursuant to the 2018 NCOA Process, all boards must submit a “pre-cancellation file” to the Secretary of State’s Office. Prior to providing the pre-cancellation file, boards must process all outstanding voter registration transactions and timely resolve duplicate registrations. To meet the goal of resolving all duplicate registrations prior to providing the pre-cancellation spreadsheet, each board must complete the following steps:

1. Receive from all designated agencies and process all voter registration transactions received by the close of business on **June 8, 2022**.³
2. Resolve all outstanding duplicate registrations by the close of business on **June 10, 2022**.

This timeline must be followed to ensure that each board resolves duplicate registrations without being impacted by another board’s processing of voter registration transactions. No earlier than **June 16, 2022**, boards may resume processing voter registration transactions received after **June 8, 2022**.

On the day shown below, boards must upload the spreadsheet containing the records of registrations that are pending cancellation pursuant to the 2018 NCOA Process:

- **June 13, 2022:** Adams through Guernsey
- **June 14, 2022:** Hamilton through Muskingum
- **June 15, 2022:** Noble through Wyandot

The pre-cancellation file format is the same as for the registration readiness file and must be uploaded to the board’s SharePoint folder in a .csv format. Each record provided in the spreadsheet must meet the following data conditions:

- The record is in active-confirmation status as a result of the 2018 NCOA Process.

- The record appears on the 2018 Out-of-County NCOA list.
- The record's registration date is before February 20, 2018.
- The record does not contain voter history on or after May 8, 2018.
- The record does not contain any voter-initiated activity between the date the confirmation notice was mailed and the date the data is compiled for the pre-cancellation list. Voter-initiated activity includes voting, submitting a valid absentee ballot application, registering to vote, updating or confirming an address with a board of elections or the BMV, or signing a candidate or issue petition that is verified by a board of elections.⁴
- The record appears on the registration readiness notice spreadsheet.

Boards are prohibited from cancelling any registration that appears on a “Do Not Cancel” list from the Secretary of State’s Office.

B. CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2018 NCOA PROCESS RECORDS

Once the Secretary of State’s Office reviews the list of voter registration records pending cancellation, each board will receive an email instructing the board to proceed with cancelling the registrations. The boards must not cancel any registration until receipt of that email. All identified records must be cancelled by **July 1, 2022**.

Boards of elections must not cancel any registration pursuant to the 2018 NCOA Process to which any of the following apply:

1. The registration appears on the “Do Not Cancel” list accompanying this Directive;
2. The registration is impacted by a voter registration vendor’s error known to the board;
3. The board is missing voter history in their county voter registration database from any election between March 15, 2016 through the 2022 Primary Election; or
4. The registration appears on the Secretary of State’s Statewide Voter Registration Database (“SWVRD”) in “active” status.

On the day shown below, boards must upload the spreadsheet containing the registrations that received the registration readiness notice and were cancelled:

- **July 5, 2022:** Adams through Guernsey
- **July 6, 2022:** Hamilton through Muskingum
- **July 7, 2022:** Noble through Wyandot

The cancellation file format is the same as described above for the registration readiness file and pre-cancellation file. The cancellation file must be uploaded to the board’s SharePoint folder in a .csv format.

To meet the goal of resolving all duplicate registrations prior to providing the pre-cancellation spreadsheet, each board must complete the following steps:

1. Receive from all designated agencies and process all voter registration transactions received by the close of business on **July 6, 2022**.
2. Resolve all outstanding duplicate registrations by the close of business on **July 8, 2022**.

This timeline must be followed to ensure that each board resolves duplicate registrations without being impacted by another board’s processing of voter registration transactions. No earlier than **July 14, 2022**, boards may resume processing voter registration transactions received after **July 8, 2022**.

On the day shown below, boards must upload the spreadsheet containing the records of registrations that are pending cancellation pursuant to the 2018 Supplemental process:

- **July 11, 2022:** Adams through Guernsey
- **July 12, 2022:** Hamilton through Muskingum
- **July 13, 2022:** Noble through Wyandot

The pre-cancellation file format is the same as for the registration readiness file and must be uploaded to the board’s SharePoint folder in a .csv format. Each record provided in the spreadsheet must meet the following data conditions:

- The record is in active-confirmation status because of the 2018 Supplemental process;
- The record appears on the 2018 Supplemental list;
- The record’s registration date is before March 15, 2016;
- The record does not contain voter history on or after March 15, 2016;
- The record does not contain any voter-initiated activity between the date the confirmation notice was mailed and the date the data is compiled for the pre-cancellation list. Voter-initiated activity includes voting, submitting a valid absentee ballot application, registering

to vote, updating or confirming an address with a board of elections or the BMV, or signing a candidate or issue petition that is verified by a board of elections;⁵ and

- The record appears on the registration readiness notice spreadsheet.

Boards are prohibited from cancelling any registration that appears on a “Do Not Cancel” list from the Secretary of State’s Office.

B. CANCELLATION SPREADSHEET: 2018 SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS RECORDS

Once the Secretary of State’s Office reviews the list of voter registration records pending cancellation, each board will receive an email instructing the board to proceed with cancelling the registrations. The boards must not cancel any registration until receipt of that email. All identified records must be cancelled by **August 8, 2022**.

Boards of elections must not cancel any registration pursuant to the 2018 Supplemental Process to which any of the following apply:

1. The registration appears on the “Do Not Cancel” list accompanying this Directive;
2. The registration is impacted by a voter registration vendor’s error known to the board;
3. The board is missing voter history in their county voter registration database from any election between March 15, 2016 through the 2022 Primary Election; or
4. The registration appears on the Secretary of State’s Statewide Voter Registration Database (“SWVRD”) in “active” status.

On the day shown below, boards must upload the spreadsheet containing the registrations that received the registration readiness notice and were cancelled:

- **August 9, 2022:** Adams through Guernsey
- **August 10, 2022:** Hamilton through Muskingum
- **August 11, 2022:** Noble through Wyandot

The cancellation file format is the same as described above for the registration readiness file and pre-cancellation file. The cancellation file must be uploaded to the board’s SharePoint folder in a .csv format.

C. APRI EXCEPTION: RECORDS PERTAINING TO THE 2018 SUPPLEMENTAL PROCESS

For the purposes of the 2022 November General Election, a provisional ballot cast during the early in-person absentee voting period or on Election Day by a voter who is not registered to vote in the State of Ohio may be counted if all of the following apply (the “APRI Exception”):

- (1) The individual’s voter registration was cancelled in 2022 (confirmation notice mailed in 2018) pursuant to the Supplemental Process;
- (2) The voter’s provisional ballot affirmation reflects an address within the precinct in which the voter currently resides, and the voter was previously registered to vote within that same county prior to cancellation;
- (3) The board of elections does not have information that the voter was deceased, incarcerated on a felony conviction, or adjudicated as incompetent under Ohio law by a county probate court after the individual’s registration record was cancelled; and
- (4) The voter’s provisional ballot affirmation form and the ballot otherwise comply with all applicable laws and directives.⁶

IV. MAINTAINING RECORDS OF CANCELLATION

Each board must work with its voter registration vendor to ensure that its county voter registration system maintains and can produce a list of voter registrations cancelled pursuant this Directive. Boards must record all of the following in their county’s voter registration system:

- The date that it mailed a registration readiness notice ([Secretary of State Form 255-A-3 – Updated 2/2022](#)) to an elector;
- If the elector responds to the notice, the date on which the elector responded; and
- If the elector does not respond to the notice, the date the registration was cancelled.

Boards of elections must maintain and make available for public inspection and copying at a reasonable cost all records concerning the implementation of programs and activities conducted for the purpose of ensuring the accuracy and currency of registration lists, including the names and addresses of all registered electors sent confirmation notices and whether the elector responded to the confirmation notice.⁷

DIRECTIVE 2022-25 - Ballots and Candidates for May 3, 2022 Primary Election for Offices Not Impacted by Redistricting

RELEASED: February 22, 2022

SUMMARY

- *Directive 2022-25* provides the certified forms of the official ballots to be used in the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.
- **This Directive does not apply to the offices of U.S. Representative to Congress, Ohio General Assembly, and State Central Committee.**
- There are no write-in candidates that filed for statewide office.

INSTRUCTIONS

In lieu of issuing a separate Directive covering ballot layout and proofing, the Secretary of State (SOS) is directing the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) to use *Directive 2022-25*, in conjunction with Chapter 5 of the Election Official Manual, to prepare and proof ballots for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.

I. VERIFYING DISTRICT RELATIONSHIPS

Before programming any aspect of the central tabulating system for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election, the CCBOE must verify the accuracy of district relationships in the central tabulating system against its voter registration system. This is to ensure that each voter receives the correct ballot style based upon that voter's residential address.

The CCBOE must ensure the following is completed by March 4, 2022:

- A. The SOS's precinct codes (three alphabet letters) are accurate in the tabulating system and, if appropriate, the county's voter registration system; and
- B. The precinct names correspond between the two systems.

Note: The CCBOE must upload to the statewide voter registration database (SWVRD) any changes to district relationships (including wards and precincts) that have been made in its voter registration system. Using a report provided by the SOS on Feb. 28, 2022, the CCBOE must review the report to ensure that all SOS Precinct ID Codes provided on the report match the board's voter registration system. The CCBOE will have until March 4, 2022 to return the reviewed report noting any changes.

II. OFFICIAL BALLOT FORMS

Each board of elections must provide a separate ballot for each political party listing candidates for nomination or election in a primary election. The ballot forms for this election are (*there are no minor party candidates on the May 3, 2022 Primary Election ballot*):

- Official Democratic Primary Ballot;
- Official Republican Primary Ballot; and
- Official Questions and Issues Ballot.

III. ORDER OF OFFICES FOR PRIMARY BALLOTS

A. The order of offices for **both** the Democratic and Republican ballots shall be as follows:

- Governor and Lieutenant Governor
- Attorney General
- Auditor of State
- Secretary of State
- Treasurer of State
- Chief Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-1-2023)
- Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-1-2023)
- Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-2-2023)
- United States Senator
- Judge of the Court of Appeals
- Judge of the Court of Common Pleas
- County Commissioner
- County Auditor

B. Blank Spaces for Write-In Votes

A write-in space must be provided on the ballot for every office for which the CCBOE received a valid declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate.

- **Write-In Candidates for Statewide Office:** No write-in candidates for statewide office filed for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.
- **For County Central Committee:** The CCBOE may accept valid declarations of intent to be a write-in candidate and provide a write-in space on the ballot for county central committee, even if no declarations of candidacy were filed for the positions.

C. Full or Unexpired Term

For judicial offices, the designation of “Full Term Commencing,” followed by the appropriate date, must appear on the ballot. For an unexpired term, the designation “Unexpired Term Ending,” followed by the term ending date of the office, must appear on the ballot.

The judicial offices for that court should appear in chronological order by the date the terms commence, followed by unexpired terms in descending order based on the ending date of the term.

For all other offices, the designation of term is necessary only when there is an unexpired term to elect (e.g., if a candidate is running for an unexpired term for mayor) and where two or more full terms for the office are to appear on the ballot (e.g., municipal court judge), in which case the offices should appear in chronological order by the date the terms commence. If there is both full and unexpired term for the same office, place the full term first followed by the unexpired term.

IV. CANDIDATES OF OTHER DISTRICT OFFICES (JUDGE OF COURT OF APPEALS)

Candidates for other district offices must be certified to the appropriate board(s) of elections by the most-populous county board of elections of the district.

V. OFFICIAL QUESTIONS AND ISSUES BALLOT

Offices for which candidates may be nominated or elected are presented on the ballot first, followed by the questions and issues. A sample Questions and Issues Ballot (as well as sample Democratic and Republican ballots) were included with this Directive.

Questions and issues must be grouped together in the following political subdivision order for elections held in 2022:

- School and other Districts
- County
- Municipal
- Township

The CCBOE may determine the specific order in which the questions/issues within each group are placed on the ballot, however, it should adopt a method for doing so (i.e., ordered alphabetically or by date filed, etc.).

VI. ABSENTEE BALLOTS

The CCBOE must have absentee ballots printed and ready for use by Friday, March 18, 2022 for Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (UOCAVA) voters, and by Tuesday, April 5, 2022 for regular, non-UOCAVA absentee voters.

SUMMARY

This Directive provides the certified forms of the official ballots to be used in the May 3, 2022 Primary Election. No write-in candidates for statewide office filed for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.

This Directive does not apply to the offices of U.S. Representative to Congress, Ohio General Assembly, and State Central Committee.

INSTRUCTIONS

Please note that, in lieu of issuing a separate Directive with specific details covering ballot layout and proofing the Secretary of State's Office is issuing this Directive, which must be used in conjunction with [Chapter 5 of the Election Official Manual](#) when preparing ballots for this election. [Chapter 5 of the Election Official Manual](#) provides specific instructions on the following subjects:

- Ballot format;
- Voter instructions;
- Ballot stubs;
- Partisan primary elections;
- Candidate ballots (names, restrictions, political party, rotation, etc.);
- Questions and issues ballot;
- Ballot proofs;
- Bid requirements;
- Ballot quantities;
- Logic and accuracy testing; and
- Public test.

I. VERIFYING DISTRICT RELATIONSHIPS

Before programming any aspect of the central tabulating system for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election, boards of elections must verify the accuracy of district relationships in the

central tabulating system against the county's voter registration system.¹ This is to ensure that each voter receives the correct ballot style (i.e., the correct combination of candidate offices and issues) based upon that voter's residential address.

As a part of the review for accuracy of district relationships between the county's voter registration system and its tabulating system, the board must ensure the following by March 4, 2022:

- A. The Secretary of State's precinct codes (three alphabet letters) are accurate in the tabulating system and, if appropriate, the county's voter registration system; and
- B. The precinct names correspond between the two systems.

Note: It is imperative that a board of elections upload to the statewide voter registration database ("SWVRD") any changes to district relationships (including wards and precincts) that have been made locally in the county's voter registration system ("VRS").

Using the report provided by our Office on February 28, 2022, each board must review the report to ensure that all SOS Precinct ID Codes provided on the report match the board's voter registration system. Boards will have until March 4, 2022 to return the reviewed report noting any changes.

In addition, the board must verify at least one voter record for each precinct in the SWVRD against the county's VRS to ensure accuracy.

II. OFFICIAL BALLOT FORMS

Each board of elections is to provide a separate ballot for each political party listing candidates for nomination or election in a primary election.² Accordingly, accompanying this Directive are the following ballot forms:

- Official Democratic Primary Ballot;
- Official Republican Primary Ballot; and
- Official Questions and Issues Ballot.

The names of all candidates, who have not withdrawn pursuant to [R.C. 3513.30](#), must be arranged, rotated, and printed upon the ballot in accordance with the provisions of Ohio Revised Code Chapters [3505](#), [3506](#), and [3513](#) and [Chapter 5 of the Election Official Manual](#).

- Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-1-2023)
- Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-2-2023)
- United States Senator
- Judge of the Court of Appeals
- Judge of the Court of Common Pleas
- County Commissioner
- County Auditor

B. The order of offices for **Republican Party** ballots shall be as follows:

- Governor and Lieutenant Governor
- Attorney General
- Auditor of State
- Secretary of State
- Treasurer of State
- Chief Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-1-2023)
- Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-1-2023)
- Justice of the Supreme Court (Full term commencing 1-2-2023)
- United States Senator
- Judge of Court of Appeals
- Judge of the Court of Common Pleas
- County Commissioner
- County Auditor

Candidates for statewide office appear on the sample ballot layouts provided with this Directive.

C. Blanks Spaces for Write-In Votes⁴

A write-in space must be provided on the ballot for every office for which the board of elections received a valid declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate.

- **Write-In Candidates for Statewide Office:**

No write-in candidates for statewide office filed for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.

- **For County Central Committee:** The board may accept valid declarations of intent to be a write-in candidate and provide a write-in space on the ballot for county central committee, even if no declarations of candidacy were filed for the positions.⁵

D. Full or Unexpired Term

For judicial offices, the designation of “Full Term Commencing,” followed by the appropriate date, must appear on the ballot. If for an unexpired term, the designation “Unexpired Term Ending,” followed by the term ending date of the office, must appear on the ballot.

The judicial offices for that court should appear in chronological order by the date the terms commence, followed by unexpired terms in descending order based on the ending date of the term.

For all other offices, the designation of term is necessary only when there is an unexpired term to elect (e.g., if a candidate is running for an unexpired term for mayor) and where two or more full terms for the office are to appear on the ballot (e.g., municipal court judge), in which case the offices should appear in chronological order by the date the terms commence. If there is both full and unexpired term for the same office, place the full term first followed by the unexpired term.

A 2-point rule must separate the title of the office from the names of the candidates for that office.⁶

IV. CANDIDATES OF OTHER DISTRICT OFFICES (JUDGE OF COURT OF APPEALS)

Candidates for other district offices must be certified to the appropriate board(s) of elections by the most-populous county board of elections of the district. If you are a less-populous county of a district and have not received a list of candidates from the most-populous county, you must contact the most-populous county before programming your ballots.

V. OFFICIAL QUESTIONS AND ISSUES BALLOT⁷

Offices for which candidates may be nominated or elected are presented on the ballot first, followed by the questions and issues. The Official Questions and Issues Ballot must be used for all voting systems. The ballot form also contains examples of some of the local questions and issues that may appear on the ballot in your county. Not every category or type of question/issue will appear on every ballot in every county, so please apply as much of the form as is appropriate to the ballots in your county.

Questions and issues must be grouped together in the following political subdivision order for elections held in 2022:

- School and other Districts
- County
- Municipal
- Township

Each board of elections may determine the specific order in which the questions/issues within each group are placed on the ballot in that county, however, a board should adopt a method for doing so (i.e., ordered alphabetically or by date filed, etc.). Absentee ballots must contain identical ordering of issues within groups to regular ballots.

Please review the appropriate sections of the Ohio Revised Code, local charter (if applicable), and the [Questions and Issues Handbook](#) for ballot language and formats that are not on the attached Official Questions and Issues Ballot.

VI. ABSENTEE BALLOTS⁸

Each board of elections must have absentee ballots printed and ready for use by Friday, March 18, 2022 (46 days before the May 3, 2022 Primary Election) for Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act (“UOCAVA”) voters, and by Tuesday, April 5, 2022 regular, non-UOCAVA absentee voters.


Boards must use the current absentee instructions ([Form 12](#)) and print them on standard letter-sized paper. Each board must ensure that the proper postage amount is printed in the box provided on the instructions. Our Office recommends boards print the instructions in color to allow the contents to stand out.

Boards must provide a copy of each absentee ballot (candidates and questions and issues) at least 47 days before the election (March 17, 2022) to the Secretary of State’s Office. Boards must upload ballots to SharePoint.

Each board must review the instructions provided in [Chapter 7 of the Election Official Manual](#) concerning incomplete absentee ballot applications.

SUMMARY

- Senate President Matt Huffman and House Speaker Robert Cupp have instructed Secretary of State Frank LaRose to prepare and carry out the May 3, 2022 Primary Election to include the Ohio House and Senate races.
- *Directive 2022-26* provides guidance on how to apply the temporary law provisions from House Bill 93 (H.B. 93) to the third set of General Assembly district maps that were passed by the Ohio Redistricting Committee on Feb. 24, 2022.
- The Secretary of State (SOS) is working with the General Assembly to develop additional temporary law changes to account for this compressed timeline, including providing additional funding.
- The SOS has filed with the Department of Defense and Federal Voter Assistance Program a UOCAVA waiver to get an extension to the existing 46-day deadline (to **April 5, 2022**) to begin mailing UOCAVA ballots. A response has not yet been received.
- Decisions in ongoing litigation may render some or all of this Directive moot. In that event, the SOS will issue additional instruction.
- Because of time constraints, the SOS has asked all boards of elections to begin preparations for the Primary Election immediately in the anticipation that the Court will uphold the new maps.
- If a few weeks from now the Court rules that the new plan is invalid, it will not be possible to conduct Ohio House and Ohio Senate primary elections with the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. FEBRUARY 24, 2022 GENERAL ASSEMBLY DISTRICT MAP AND LEGAL DESCRIPTIONS

On Feb. 24, 2022, the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed a General Assembly district plan. Shortly thereafter, Senate President Huffman and House Speaker Cupp sent a letter to Secretary LaRose directing him to immediately transmit the relevant information to all boards of elections “so that the necessary preparations may be made for carrying out the primary election on May 3, 2022.” As a result, the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) must immediately begin the process of reprogramming its voter registration system with these new General Assembly district maps. **The CCBOE cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of its voter registration system is complete.**

II. 2022 PRIMARY ELECTION DEADLINES

Pursuant to H.B. 93, the 2022 primary election filing deadline was **Feb. 2, 2022** for all candidates *other* than those for U.S. House. H.B. 93 also permits the SOS to adjust certain deadlines pertaining to the administration of the May 3, 2022 Primary Election. While the SOS doesn’t have the authority to unilaterally change the UOCAVA deadline, it has been authorized to obtain a waiver from the Department of Defense and the Federal Voting Assistance Program to receive an extension to the existing 46-day deadline (to **April 5, 2022**) to begin mailing UOCAVA ballots. A response has not yet been received.

Two deadlines that the SOS is adjusting per *Directive 2022-26* are:

- **Certification Deadline (Monday, March 14, 2022)** – The CCBOE must certify the validity and sufficiency of partisan candidate petitions and provide the names of the certified candidates to

the less populous county board(s) of elections in the district (if applicable), subject to any filers changing districts and completing their move by March 26, 2022. The CCBOE cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of its voter registration system is complete.

- **Protest Deadline (Thursday, March 17, 2022)** – Protests against partisan candidates for Ohio House, Ohio Senate, and state central committee of a political party (including write-in candidates) must be filed with the most populous county board of elections by 4:00 p.m.

Each board must be open to the public on **Saturday, March 26, 2022**, and must notify the SOS no later than 4:00 p.m. on that day if a candidate for General Assembly, as of that date, has not become a resident of the district the filer seeks to represent, filed an addendum, and updated their voter registration record to reflect their new residency. The SOS will issue a form of the ballot directive as soon as possible. Pending the outcome of the ongoing litigation, the SOS may establish or amend other deadlines and dates related to the administration of the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.

III. OHIO HOUSE AND SENATE CANDIDATES

A. DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY, PETITION, NOMINATING PETITION, OR DECLARATION OF INTENT TO BE A WRITE-IN CANDIDATE

i. REQUIREMENTS FOR FILING VALIDITY AND IDENTIFYING DISTRICTS

For candidates for Ohio House and Ohio Senate, the CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a declaration of candidacy on the basis that it does not include the number of the district the filer seeks to represent or includes an incorrect district number. The appropriate document filed by the candidate shall be deemed to include the correct number of the applicable House or Senate district in which the filer (i.e., the candidate filing to run) for Ohio House or Ohio Senate currently resides.

Section 9(C) of Article XI of the Ohio Constitution provides that when the Ohio Redistricting Committee adopts a new district plan pursuant to an order of the Ohio Supreme Court, as is currently the case, a candidate is **allowed up to 30 days** to change their residence to be eligible for election in a district in which the candidate may not currently reside. As such, the CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a declaration of candidacy filed by a person seeking nomination for Ohio House or Ohio Senate on the basis that it contains the filer's former residence address that is **not** located in the district the filer seeks to represent.

Section 4(C) of H.B. 93 implements the broad constitutional provision in Article XI, Section 9(C) by requiring any such candidate to:

1. Become a resident of the district the filer seeks to represent.
2. File an addendum to the declaration of candidacy declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate with the board of elections that indicates the filer's new address; and
3. Update their voter registration record to reflect their new residency.

Secretary LaRose interprets Section 4(C) of H.B. 93 to mean that if boards allow any such candidate the constitutionally required 30 days to change their residence, the constitutional requirement is satisfied. Thus, the requirement in Section 4(C)(1)(b) of filing the addendum indicating an intention to run in another district can be done as **the first step in the process**, not the second step.

Thus, the SOS is instructing the CCBOE to immediately:

1. Contact candidates by phone and/or email and inquire whether they intend to change their residence to run in another district and confirm such contact with any candidate by **March 1, 2022**.
2. Ask House and Senate candidates who may wish to change their residence to run in another district to file the addendum with the board no later than **4:00 p.m. on March 10, 2022**.
3. Provide House and Senate candidates with the template of the addendum included in this Directive.
4. If a candidate files the addendum with the board, then on whatever date a candidate files the addendum with the board, whether that addendum lists a new residence address or simply states the filer's intention to change their residence to a new district the filer seeks to represent, the board shall immediately begin to verify the signatures on the filer's petition based on either the filer's new residence address or the new district the filer has indicated they now seek to represent.
5. If a candidate who has filed with the board has not filed the addendum with the board by **4:00 p.m. on March 10, 2022**, the board shall begin to verify the signatures on the filer's petition under this section based on the filer's residence address as stated in their declaration of candidacy.
6. Notify the SOS no later than **4:00 p.m. on March 26, 2022** if a candidate for General Assembly, as of that date, has not become a resident of the district the filer seeks to represent, filed an addendum, and updated their voter registration record to reflect their new residency.

However, even if a candidate files the addendum with the CCBOE, it must invalidate an Ohio House or Ohio Senate declaration of candidacy if the filer **does not** take **all** three actions required in Section 4(C) of H.B. 93 on or before **March 26, 2022**.

ii. REQUIREMENTS FOR SIGNATURE VALIDITY

The CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a signature on the ground that the signer does not reside in the *new* district the filer seeks to represent (i.e., per the plan the Ohio Redistricting Commission adopted on February 24, 2022) so long as:

1. The House or Senate district in which the filer resided under the General Assembly district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission in September 2021 had territory in the county in which the signer resides; **and**

2. The *new* House or Senate district the filer seeks to represent has territory in the county in which the signer resides.

Moreover, the CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a signature on the ground that the signature was signed before a district plan for Ohio House of Representatives was adopted or enacted or took effect, provided that a signature on a nominating petition is not valid if it is dated more than one year before the date the nominating petition is filed.

IV. CANDIDATE FOR STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF A POLITICAL PARTY

A. DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY, PETITION, NOMINATING PETITION, OR DECLARATION OF INTENT TO BE A WRITE-IN CANDIDATE

i. REQUIREMENTS FOR FILING VALIDITY AND IDENTIFYING DISTRICTS

The CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a declaration of candidacy filed by a person seeking nomination for the state central committee of a political party on the basis that it does not include the number of the district the filer seeks to represent or that it includes an incorrect district number. If the filer seeks nomination for the office of the state central committee of a political party, the document shall be deemed to include the number of the applicable district in which the filer resides.

ii. REQUIREMENTS FOR SIGNATURE VALIDITY

The CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a signature for the office of state central committee of a political party on the ground that the signature was signed before a district plan of the applicable type was adopted or enacted or took effect, provided that a signature on a nominating petition is not valid if it is dated more than one year before the date the nominating petition is filed.

a. SENATE DISTRICTS

If the state central committee of a political party representation is based on Senate districts, the CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a signature for the office of state central committee of a political party on the ground that the signer does not reside in the district the filer seeks to represent so long as the filer seeks nomination for the office of member of the state central committee of a political party to represent a Senate district and:

1. The Senate district in which the filer resided under the General Assembly district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission in September 2021 had territory in the county in which the signer resides; **and**
2. The *new* Senate district the filer seeks to represent has territory in the county in which the signer resides.

V. TRANSFER OF DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY, DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY AND PETITION, NOMINATING PETITION, OR DECLARATION OF INTENT TO BE A WRITE-IN CANDIDATE

A. GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE PETITIONS

If a candidate *properly* filed their declaration of candidacy properly in the most populous county board of elections under the January 22, 2022 map by February 2, 2022, then the board of elections is required to promptly transfer that declaration of candidacy to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to Section 4(E) of H.B. 93 (if applicable).

B. U.S. HOUSE PETITIONS

The Ohio Redistricting Commission has not passed congressional district maps. District maps may not exist prior to the March 4, 2022 filing deadline for congressional candidates. If new congressional district maps do not exist prior to the March 4, 2022 filing deadline and a candidate has not yet filed their petition, those candidates for U.S. House must file in the most populous board of elections pursuant to the district maps set forth in S.B. 258.

If the Ohio Redistricting Commission passes a new congressional district map prior to the March 4, 2022 filing deadline, and a candidate has not yet filed their petition, that candidate should file their petition with the most populous county under the new district map.

If a candidate has already properly filed their petition prior to the Ohio Redistricting Commission passing a new map but prior to the filing deadline with the most populous county board of elections pursuant to S.B. 258, and the most populous county board of elections has changed under the new congressional district map, that board of elections must transfer that filing to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to the new map.

If the Ohio Redistricting Commission does pass a new congressional district map following March 4, 2022, and the most populous county changed, the board of elections that the declaration of candidacy was filed in must transfer that filing to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to the new map.



DIRECTIVE 2022-26

February 26, 2022

To: All County Boards of Elections
Board Members, Directors, and Deputy Directors

Re: State House and Senate District Maps and House Bill ("H.B." 93)

I recognize the unprecedented nature of this Directive and the incredible challenge it presents to each of our 88 county boards of elections. The General Assembly has the legal authority to set the time, place, and manner of Ohio's elections, and they have made clear their instructions to include the state House and Senate contests on the May 3, 2022 Primary Election ballot. Senate President Matt Huffman and House Speaker Robert Cupp sent a letter to me on Thursday, February 24, 2022 stating the following:

"... We are providing your office with the underlying information for the newly adopted plan, including the shape files.

"Please immediately transmit the relevant information to all the state's boards of elections as you deem appropriate so that the necessary preparations may be made for carrying out the primary election on May 3rd, 2022."

I have communicated to the legislative leaders the risks associated with rushing this process and shared your concerns about the compressed timeline for everything from candidate certification and ballot preparation to the programming and testing of voting equipment. These are serious concerns, but our directive is clear, and I am confident that, together, we will work tirelessly to achieve it. Winston Churchill said, "It's not enough that we do our best; sometimes we have to do what's required." We have the hardest-working elections officials in the nation, and you are known for doing your best. This one requires more. Beyond doing our best, we will need unprecedented courage, optimism, and maybe a little divine blessing to get it done. I told the leaders of our General Assembly that we will do everything we can to rise to their challenge. As it relates to conducting this unprecedented election, I reminded them that our State's motto is: "With God all things are possible."

SUMMARY

On February 24, 2022, the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed (4-3) a third General Assembly district map. Attached to this Directive are the following:

- House Shapefile;
- Senate Shapefile;
- State House and Senate Equivalency Files (otherwise known as BAFs or block assignment files);
- Addendum to Declaration of Candidacy, Nominating Petition or Declaration of Intent to be a Write-in Candidate;
- State House District – County Population and Filing Location – September 2021;

- State House District – County Population and Filing Location – January 22, 2022;
- State House District – County Population and Filing Location – February 24, 2022;
- State Senate District – County Population and Filing Location – September 2021;
- State Senate District – County Population and Filing Location – January 22, 2022;
- State Senate District – County Population and Filing Location – February 24, 2022;
- U.S. House District – County Population and Filing Location – S.B. 258; and
- Letter from Senate President Huffman and House Speaker Cupp to Secretary LaRose, February 24, 2022.

Governor DeWine signed H.B. 93 into law on January 28, 2022 enacting many temporary law changes to the requirements for the 2022 primary election. Ultimately, the Ohio Redistricting Commission needed to adopt a new district plan a few weeks later. This Directive provides guidance on how to apply the temporary law provisions from H.B. 93 to the third set of General Assembly district maps. Please know that my Office is actively working with the General Assembly to develop additional temporary law changes to account for this incredibly compressed timeline, including providing additional funding for the county boards of elections. My Office has also filed with the Department of Defense and Federal Voter Assistance Program a UOCAVA waiver pursuant to 52 U.S.C. 20302(g) for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.

Additionally, decisions in ongoing litigation¹ may render some or all of this Directive moot. In that event, my Office will issue additional instruction. As you know, the redistricting process has been the subject of much litigation. This Directive is not contrary to any order of the Ohio Supreme Court, nor should it be construed as such. This new General Assembly district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission was filed with my office and is presumed valid. If there is additional litigation over this new district plan, the outcome of that litigation will be that the new plan is either valid or invalid. Because of the severe time constraints under which we are operating to hold Ohio House and Ohio Senate primary races with the May 3, 2022 Primary Election, we must begin preparations for those elections immediately in the anticipation that the Court will uphold the new plan. Obviously, if a few weeks from now the Court rules that the new plan is invalid, it will not be possible to conduct Ohio House and Ohio Senate primary elections with the May 3, 2022 Primary Election.

The Ohio Supreme Court issued a briefing schedule requiring that objections, if any, to the General Assembly maps submitted on February 25, 2022 by the Ohio Redistricting Commission be filed by 9 a.m. on Monday, February 28, 2022 and granted the Commission three days (Thursday, March 3, 2022) after the objections are filed to respond.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. FEBRUARY 24, 2022 GENERAL ASSEMBLY DISTRICT MAP AND LEGAL DESCRIPTIONS

On February 24, 2022, the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed a General Assembly district plan. Shortly thereafter, Senate President Matt Huffman and House Speaker Bob Cupp sent a letter

directing me to immediately transmit the relevant information to all boards of elections “so that the necessary preparations may be made for carrying out the primary election on May 3, 2022.”²

As such, given the incredibly unfortunate impact that redistricting litigation has had on the election calendar and our ability to administer an election in a manner that will inevitably lead to the best chances of success, all boards must immediately begin the process of reprogramming their voter registration systems with the February 24, 2022 General Assembly district maps.

The State House and Senate district shapefiles, and equivalency files accompany this Directive. My Office is waiting for the House and Senate legal descriptions from the General Assembly. We will forward those to you as soon as we receive them. However, boards and members of the public may find the most updated district maps at OhioSoS.gov/Districts.

Boards cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of the voter registration system is complete. Whenever an area included in a district is less than a county, the legal description is a political subdivision, such as city, village, township, municipal ward, or precinct and portions thereof. The descriptions are based on boundaries as they existed when the data was collected by Ohio University. If the board of elections changed precinct boundaries or if there were municipal ward boundary changes or annexations in the past year, the board needs to consider that the new assignments were made based on previous data. For example, if the board combined Precinct A and C into a new Precinct A, and Precinct A is listed in the legal description, then it is referring to the old Precinct A portion of the new Precinct A.

II. 2022 PRIMARY ELECTION DEADLINES

Pursuant to H.B. 93, the 2022 primary election filing deadline was **February 2, 2022** for all candidates *other* than those for U.S. House.

H.B. 93 also permits the Secretary of State to adjust deadlines pertaining to the administration of the May 3, 2022 primary election *except* for the following: ³

- The deadline to file a declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate;
- The deadline to certify a ballot issue or question to the election officials or to file a petition with the election officials to place a question or issue on the ballot at the May 3, 2022 primary election or a special election on that date;
- The UOCAVA deadline Unless the Secretary of State obtains a waiver pursuant to 52 U.S.C. 20302(g) for the May 3, 2022 primary election; and
- Any deadline that, under Ohio law, falls on or after April 3, 2022.

The Secretary submitted a UOCAVA waiver request to the Department of Defense and Federal Voting Assistance Program. We will keep you informed on the outcome of that request.

Therefore, the certification and protest deadline for candidates to the offices of Ohio House of Representatives (“Ohio House”), Ohio Senate, and state central committee of a political party shall be as follows:

- **Monday, March 14, 2022** – Most populous county board of elections or board of elections must certify the validity and sufficiency of partisan candidate petitions and provide the names of the certified candidates to the less populous county board(s) of elections in the district, subject to any filers changing districts and completing their move by March 26, 2022. Boards cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of the voter registration system is complete.
- **Thursday, March 17, 2022** – Protests against partisan candidates for Ohio House, Ohio Senate, and state central committee of a political party (including write-in candidates) must be filed with the most populous county board of elections by 4:00 p.m.

Each board must be open to the public on Saturday, March 26, 2022, and must notify my Office no later than 4:00 p.m. on March 26, 2022 if a candidate for General Assembly, as of that date, has not become a resident of the district the filer seeks to represent, filed an addendum, and updated their voter registration record to reflect their new residency. My Office will issue a form of the ballot directive as soon as possible. Pending the outcome of the ongoing litigation mentioned above, the Secretary may establish or amend other deadlines and dates related to the administration of the May 3, 2022 primary election.

III. OHIO HOUSE AND SENATE CANDIDATES

A. DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY, PETITION, NOMINATING PETITION, OR DECLARATION OF INTENT TO BE A WRITE-IN CANDIDATE

i. REQUIREMENTS FOR FILING VALIDITY AND IDENTIFYING DISTRICTS

For candidates for Ohio House and Ohio Senate, boards are prohibited from invalidating a declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate on the basis that it does not include the number of the district the filer seeks to represent or includes an incorrect district number.⁴ The appropriate document filed by the candidate shall be deemed to include the correct number of the applicable House or Senate district in which the filer (i.e. the candidate filing to run) for Ohio House or Ohio Senate currently resides.⁵

On February 24, 2022, in conjunction with the Ohio Redistricting Commission's adoption of the new General Assembly district plan on February 24, 2022, the Commission approved a motion that I made to authorize me to issue to the boards of election directives by which House and Senate candidates who have filed to run shall comply with Article XI, Section 9(C), if any candidates wish to do so.

This statement made it clear that I have the responsibility to reasonably interpret the law to administer an election under such unprecedented time constraints. In the alternative, Section 9(C) of Article XI of the Ohio Constitution provides that when the Ohio Redistricting Committee adopts a new district plan pursuant to an order of the Ohio Supreme Court, as is currently the case, a candidate is allowed up to 30 days to change their residence to be eligible for election in a district in which the candidate may not currently reside. As such, boards are prohibited from invalidating a declaration of

candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate filed by a person seeking nomination for Ohio House or Ohio Senate on the basis that it contains the filer's former residence address that is *not* located in the district the filer seeks to represent.

Section 4(C) of H.B. 93 implements the broad constitutional provision in Article XI, Section 9(C) by requiring any such candidate to:

- (1) Become a resident of the district the filer seeks to represent;
- (2) File an addendum to the declaration of candidacy declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate with the board of elections that indicates the filer's new address; and
- (3) Update their voter registration record to reflect their new residency.

The Redistricting Commission adopted the present General Assembly district plan on February 24, 2022. Thus, the 30-day period provided for by Article XI, Section 9(C) ends on March 26, 2022. The constitutional provision simply says that the new district plan "shall allow thirty days for persons to change residence in order to be eligible for election." Thus, Section 9(C)'s irreducible minimum is that any such candidate must be given 30 days to change their residence to run in another district.

While Section 4(C) of H.B. 93 attempts to implement Article XI, Section 9(C) by stating the three requirements that a candidate must undertake to qualify under Section 9(C) to run in another district, I am interpreting Section 4(C) of H.B. 93 to mean that as long as we allow any such candidate the constitutionally required 30 days to change their residence, which we are, the constitutional requirement is satisfied.

Thus, the requirement in Section 4(C)(1)(b) of filing the addendum indicating an intention to run in another district can be done as the first step in the process, not the second step. Once a candidate files the addendum with the board stating their intention to be a candidate in another district, the candidate may later perfect their residency in the new district and change their voter registration to the new district within the remainder of the 30-day period.

Thus, I am instructing all boards of election with which an Ohio House or Ohio Senate candidate filed petitions to immediately:

- (1) Contact all such candidates by phone and/or email, inform them of this constitutional provision, and inquire of each of them whether they intend to change their residence to run in another district and confirm such contact with any candidate by **March 1, 2022**.
- (2) Ask all such House and Senate candidates who may wish to change their residence to run in another district to file the addendum contemplated by Section 4(C)(1)(b) of H.B. 93 with the board the no later than **4:00 p.m. on March 10, 2022**.
- (3) Provide all such House and Senate candidates with the attached template of the addendum contemplated by Section 4(C)(1)(b) of H.B. 93. The attached addendum template includes not only a space for the filer's new residence address, but in lieu of an actual new residence address, the template alternatively includes space in which the filer may simply state an indication of the filer's intent to change their residence to a new district the filer seeks to represent.

- (4) If a candidate files the addendum with the board, then on whatever date a candidate files the addendum with the board, whether that addendum lists a new residence address or simply states the filer's intention to change their residence to a new district the filer seeks to represent, the board shall immediately begin to verify the signatures on the filer's petition under this section based on either the filer's new residence address or the new district the filer has indicated they now seek to represent.
- (5) If a candidate who has filed with the board has not filed the addendum with the board by **4:00 p.m. on March 10, 2022**, the board shall begin to verify the signatures on the filer's petition under this section based on the filer's residence address as stated in their declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate.
- (6) Notify my Office no later than **4:00 p.m. on March 26, 2022** if a candidate for General Assembly, as of that date, has not become a resident of the district the filer seeks to represent, filed an addendum, and updated their voter registration record to reflect their new residency.

However, even if a candidate files the addendum with a board of elections, the board must invalidate an Ohio House or Ohio Senate declaration of candidacy declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate if the filer does not take all three actions required in Section 4(C) of H.B. 93 on or before **March 26, 2022**.

ii. REQUIREMENTS FOR SIGNATURE VALIDITY

Boards are prohibited from invalidating a signature on a declaration of candidacy and petition or nominating petition filed by a person seeking nomination for Ohio House or Ohio Senate on the ground that the signer does not reside in the *new* district the filer seeks to represent (i.e., per the plan the Ohio Redistricting Commission adopted on February 24, 2022) so long as:

- (1) The House or Senate district in which the filer resided under the General Assembly district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission in September 2021 had territory in the county in which the signer resides; and
- (2) The *new* House or Senate district the filer seeks to represent has territory in the county in which the signer resides.⁶

Attached with this Directive is a list of counties within each district under the General Assembly district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission in September 2021 and a list of counties within each district under the General Assembly district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission on February 24, 2022.

Moreover, boards are prohibited from invalidating a signature on a declaration of candidacy and petition or nominating petition filed by a person seeking nomination for Ohio House or Ohio Senate on the ground that the signature was signed before a district plan for Ohio House of Representatives was adopted or enacted or took effect, provided that a signature on a nominating petition is not valid if it is dated more than one year before the date the nominating petition is filed.⁷

IV. CANDIDATE FOR STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF A POLITICAL PARTY

A. DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY, PETITION, NOMINATING PETITION, OR DECLARATION OF INTENT TO BE A WRITE-IN CANDIDATE

i. REQUIREMENTS FOR FILING VALIDITY AND IDENTIFYING DISTRICTS

Boards are prohibited from invalidating a declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate filed by a person seeking nomination for the state central committee of a political party on the basis that it does not include the number of the district the filer seeks to represent or that it includes an incorrect district number. If the filer seeks nomination for the office of the state central committee of a political party, the document shall be deemed to include the number of the applicable district in which the filer resides.⁸

ii. REQUIREMENTS FOR SIGNATURE VALIDITY

Boards are prohibited from invalidating a signature on a declaration of candidacy and petition or nominating petition filed by a person seeking nomination for the office of state central committee of a political party on the ground that the signature was signed before a district plan of the applicable type was adopted or enacted or took effect, provided that a signature on a nominating petition is not valid if it is dated more than one year before the date the nominating petition is filed.⁹

a. SENATE DISTRICTS

If the state central committee of a political party representation is based on Senate districts, boards are prohibited from invalidating a signature on a declaration of candidacy and petition or nominating petition filed by a person seeking nomination for the office of state central committee of a political party on the ground that the signer does not reside in the district the filer seeks to represent so long as the filer seeks nomination for the office of member of the state central committee of a political party to represent a Senate district and:

(1) The Senate district in which the filer resided under the General Assembly district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission in September 2021 had territory in the county in which the signer resides; **and**

(2) The *new* Senate district the filer seeks to represent has territory in the county in which the signer resides.¹⁰

V. TRANSFER OF DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY, DECLARATION OF CANDIDACY AND PETITION, NOMINATING PETITION, OR DECLARATION OF INTENT TO BE A WRITE-IN CANDIDATE

Please review [Directive 2022-03](#) and the following instruction set forth below.

A. GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE PETITIONS

As you know, the filing deadline for General Assembly declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate was February 2, 2022 with the most populous county board of elections pursuant to the January 22, 2022 Ohio Redistricting Commission maps. The Ohio Supreme Court invalidated those maps on February 7, 2022. The Ohio Redistricting Commission passed new Ohio House and Senate maps on February 24, 2022. As such, the most populous county may have changed. If a candidate *properly* filed their declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate properly in the most populous county board of elections under the January 22, 2022 map by February 2, 2022, then the board of elections is required to promptly transfer that declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to Section 4(E) of H.B. 93.

B. U.S. HOUSE PETITIONS

Conversely, the Ohio Redistricting Commission has not passed congressional district maps. District maps may not exist prior to the March 4, 2022 filing deadline for congressional candidates. If new congressional district maps do not exist prior to the March 4, 2022 filing deadline and a candidate has not yet filed their petition, those candidates for U.S. House must file in the most populous board of elections pursuant to the district maps set forth in S.B. 258. That list is attached.

If the Ohio Redistricting Commission passes a new congressional district map prior to the March 4, 2022 filing deadline, and a candidate has not yet filed their petition, that candidate should file their petition with the most populous county under the new district map.

However, if a candidate has already properly filed their petition prior to the Ohio Redistricting Commission passing a new map but prior to the filing deadline with the most populous county board of elections pursuant to S.B. 258, and the most populous county board of elections has changed under the new congressional district map, that board of elections must transfer that filing to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to the new map.

If the Ohio Redistricting Commission does pass a new congressional district map following March 4, 2022, and the most populous county changed, the board of elections that the declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate was filed in must transfer that filing to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to the new map.

If the General Assembly makes any changes to the election administrative procedures in temporary law, my Office will issue guidance as soon as possible.

Each board of elections director must share this Directive with its legal counsel, the county prosecuting attorney, and voter registration system and voting system vendors as soon as possible. If

SUMMARY

- *Directive 2022-27* provides guidance on how to apply the temporary law provisions from House Bill 93 (H.B. 93) to the second congressional district map that was passed by the Ohio Redistricting Committee on March 2, 2022.
- The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of its voter registration system.
- The filing deadline for the office of Representative to Congress (U.S. House) remains March 4, 2022.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. MARCH 2, 2022 CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT MAP AND LEGAL DESCRIPTIONS

On March 2, 2022, the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed a second congressional district map. The CCBOE must immediately begin the process of reprogramming its voter registration system based on these new congressional district maps. **Boards cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of the voter registration system is complete.**

II. 2022 PRIMARY ELECTION DEADLINES

Pursuant to H.B. 93, the U.S. House filing deadline for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election is 4 p.m. on March 4, 2022. This deadline applies for both (1) candidates who will file an applicable declaration of candidacy to appear on the ballot; and (2) individuals who will file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate.

Using the authority to adjust deadlines granted by H.B. 93, the Secretary of State (SOS) has set the following deadlines:

- **Certification Deadline (Monday, March 14, 2022)** – The CCBOE must certify the validity and sufficiency of partisan candidate petitions and provide the names of the certified candidates to the less populous county board(s) of elections in the district (if applicable).
- **Protest Deadline (Thursday, March 17, 2022)** – Protests against partisan candidates for U.S. House (including write-in candidates) must be filed with the most populous county board of elections by 4:00 p.m.

III. OHIO HOUSE CANDIDATE PETITIONS

A. DISTRICT VALIDITY

For candidates for U.S. House, the CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a declaration of candidacy on the basis that it does not include the number of the congressional district the filer seeks to represent or includes an incorrect district number. According to H.B. 93, the filer must notify the CCBOE in writing of the district the filer seeks to represent.

B. SIGNATURE VALIDITY

The CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a signature on the ground that the signer does not reside in the *new* congressional district the filer seeks to represent (i.e., per the plan the Ohio Redistricting Commission adopted on March 2, 2022) so long as:

1. The congressional district in which the filer resided under the district plan described in S.B. 258 of the 134th General Assembly had territory in the county in which the signer resides; **and**
2. The *new* congressional district the filer seeks to represent has territory in the county in which the signer resides.

Moreover, the CCBOE is prohibited from invalidating a signature on the ground that the signature was signed before the district plan was adopted or enacted or took effect, provided that a signature on a nominating petition is not valid if it is dated more than one year before the date the nominating petition is filed.

IV. FILING LOCATIONS

As set forth in *Directive 2022-26*, any U.S. House candidate who has not yet filed their petition with the most populous county board of elections, must file their petition with the most populous county board of elections pursuant to the March 2, 2022 congressional map by March 4, 2022 because the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed a new congressional map *prior* to March 4, 2022.

However, if a candidate already properly filed their petition with the most populous county board of elections pursuant to the district maps set forth in S.B. 258, prior to the issuance of this Directive, and the most populous county board of elections has changed pursuant to the March 2, 2022 congressional map, then the board of elections that originally received the filing must transfer that filing to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to the March 2, 2022 congressional map.

SUMMARY

On March 2, 2022, the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed (5-2) a second congressional district map following the Ohio Supreme Court's decision declaring the S.B. 258 congressional map unconstitutional.¹ Attached to this Directive are the following:

- Congressional District Shapefile;
- Equivalency Files (otherwise known as BAFs or block assignment files);
- Notification to Election Officials of District Sought – [Form 2-Y](#);
- Congressional District – County Population and Filing Location – March 2, 2022; and
- Congressional District – County Population and Filing Location – S.B. 258 of the 134th General Assembly.

INSTRUCTIONS

I. MARCH 2, 2022 CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT MAP AND LEGAL DESCRIPTIONS

On March 2, 2022, the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed a district plan for the office of Representative to Congress ("U.S. House"). As with [Directive 2022-26](#), given the unfortunate time constraints, all boards must immediately begin the process of reprogramming their voter registration systems based on the March 2, 2022 congressional district maps.

The congressional district shapefiles and equivalency files accompany this Directive. My Office is waiting for the legal descriptions from the General Assembly. We will forward those to you as soon as we receive them.

Boards cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of the voter registration system is complete. Whenever an area included in a district is less than a county, the legal description is a political subdivision, such as city, village, township, municipal ward, or precinct and portions thereof. The descriptions are based on boundaries as they existed when the data was collected by Ohio University. If the board of elections changed precinct boundaries or if there were municipal ward boundary changes or annexations in the past year, the board needs to consider that the new assignments were made based on previous data. For example, if the board combined Precinct A and

C into a new Precinct A, and Precinct A is listed in the legal description, then it is referring to the old Precinct A portion of the new Precinct A.

II. 2022 PRIMARY ELECTION DEADLINES

Pursuant to H.B. 93, the U.S. House filing deadline for the May 3, 2022 Primary Election is **4:00 p.m. on March 4, 2022**. This deadline applies for both (1) candidates who will file an applicable declaration of candidacy to appear on the ballot; and (2) individuals who will file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate.²

Using the authority to adjust deadlines granted by H.B. 93,³ I direct that the certification and protest deadline for U.S. House candidates shall be as follows:

- **Monday, March 14, 2022** – Most populous county board of elections or board of elections must certify the validity and sufficiency of partisan candidate petitions and provide the names of the certified candidates to the less populous county board(s) of elections in the district. Boards cannot verify or certify candidate petitions until the reprogramming of the voter registration system is complete.
- **Thursday, March 17, 2022** – Protests against partisan candidates for U.S. House (including write-in candidates) must be filed with the most populous county board of elections by 4:00 p.m.

III. U.S. HOUSE CANDIDATE PETITIONS

A. DISTRICT VALIDITY

For candidates for U.S. House, boards are prohibited from invalidating a declaration of candidacy, declaration of candidacy and petition, nominating petition, or declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate on the basis that it does not include the number of the congressional district the filer seeks to represent or includes an incorrect district number.⁴ According to H.B. 93, the filer must notify the election officials in writing of the district the filer seeks to represent.⁵ Our Office prescribed [Form 2-Y](#) for this purpose. Boards must continue to provide and accept this form for U.S. House candidates.

B. SIGNATURE VALIDITY

Boards are prohibited from invalidating a signature on a declaration of candidacy and petition or nominating petition filed by a person seeking nomination for U.S. House on the ground that the signer does not reside in the *new* congressional district the filer seeks to represent (i.e., per the plan the Ohio Redistricting Commission adopted on March 2, 2022) so long as:

- (1) The congressional district in which the filer resided under the district plan described in S.B. 258 of the 134th General Assembly had territory in the county in which the signer resides;
and

- (2) The *new* congressional district the filer seeks to represent has territory in the county in which the signer resides.⁶

Attached with this Directive is a list of counties within each district under the district plan described in S.B. 258 of the 134th General Assembly and a list of counties within each district under the district plan adopted by the Ohio Redistricting Commission on March 2, 2022.

Moreover, boards are prohibited from invalidating a signature on a declaration of candidacy and petition or nominating petition filed by a person seeking nomination for U.S. House on the ground that the signature was signed before the district plan for was adopted or enacted or took effect, provided that a signature on a nominating petition is not valid if it is dated more than one year before the date the nominating petition is filed.⁷

IV. FILING LOCATIONS

[Directive 2022-26](#) directed candidates for U.S. House to file in the most populous board of elections *pursuant to the district maps set forth in S.B. 258* in the event that the Ohio Redistricting Commission did not adopt a new congressional map by the filing deadline of March 4, 2022. The Ohio Redistricting Commission since adopted new maps.


Therefore, and as set forth in [Directive 2022-26](#), any U.S. House candidate who has not yet filed their petition with the most populous county board of elections, must file their petition with the most populous county board of elections pursuant to the March 2, 2022 congressional map by March 4, 2022 because the Ohio Redistricting Commission passed a new congressional map *prior* to March 4, 2022.

However, if a candidate already properly filed their petition with the most populous county board of elections pursuant to the district maps set forth in S.B. 258, prior to the issuance of this Directive, and the most populous county board of elections has changed pursuant to the March 2, 2022 congressional map, then the board of elections that originally received the filing must transfer that filing to the new most populous county board of elections pursuant to the March 2, 2022 congressional map.

If the General Assembly makes any changes to the election administrative procedures in temporary law, my Office will issue guidance as soon as possible.

Each board of elections director must share this Directive with its legal counsel, the county prosecuting attorney, and voter registration system and voting system vendors as soon as possible. Overview

Chapter 2 (Boards of Elections Organization and Operations) of the Election Official Manual states before a board uses signature stamps, it must:

Adopt a policy governing when their signature may be used and who may access their signature stamp.¹

A board may use signature stamps as a tool for providing individual members' signatures. Each Board Member is responsible and accountable for how their individual signature is used. Board Members must be physically present for board meetings (unless a Board Member is excused or state law or Secretary of State (SOS) directive permits video conference, virtual or teleconference attendance) regardless of the board's signature stamp policy. A Board Member is prohibited from misusing a signature stamp or using it as a means to abdicate their duties.

Unauthorized Signature Stamp Usage

- All **Unofficial Canvass** reports, including the Unofficial Certification of Results Signature Form, must be signed by the Director, Deputy Director, and each Board Member *present* for the unofficial canvass. The board may not authorize the use of a signature stamp for any Unofficial Canvass report.²
- All **Official Canvass** reports, including the Official Certification of Results Signature Form, must be signed by the appropriate board personnel before being submitted to the Secretary of State, another board of elections, or to another public entity. The board may not authorize the use of a signature stamp for *any* Official Canvass report.³
- If, after the Official Canvass is complete, a candidate race is tied, the board must break the tie by lot and declare a winner before ordering a recount. A majority of the Board Members must sign this declaration, and the board may not authorize the use

of a signature stamp for this declaration.⁴

- As a normal course of business, a signature stamp should not be used to sign contracts. However, in an emergent situation, a Board Member, the Director, or Deputy Director can authorize the use of their signature stamp for a contract.
- A signature stamp is not authorized for use with employee Time-Off Request or Overtime Forms, or the Director or Deputy's timesheets.

Authorized Signature Stamp Usage

A signature stamp is authorized to be used for Board Members in the following circumstances:

- A Board Member is unavailable to personally sign (out of the office, out of town, hospitalized, emergency, etc.), excluding the unauthorized uses of a signature stamp already outlined in this policy.
- On fiscal vouchers under \$25,000.
- A Board Member has approved a board action but did not sign an approval form (e.g., virtual meeting or oversight).

A signature stamp is authorized to be used for the Director or Deputy Director in the following circumstances:

- Vouchers after Board Meeting approval by Board Members, customarily after they are signed by the Chairperson.
- On fiscal vouchers under \$25,000.
- The signature stamp of the Director or Deputy Director may be used on employee timesheets (except the Director's stamp may not be used on the Deputy Director's timesheet, and vice versa).
- Pre-Approval by the Director in his absence of Procurement Supporting documentation from Fiscal Services. (This does not include contracts.)
- Campaign Finance referral letters.
- Requests for items to be placed on a board meeting agenda.
- Other documents upon written/verbal approval from either the Director or Deputy Director, excluding documents noted as being unauthorized for a signature stamp in this policy.

In all circumstances, a Board Member, the Director, or Deputy Director must direct the use of their signature stamp, or personally use the signature stamp themselves.

The ORC 3501.38 (E) (1) General Rules states "(E)(1) On each petition paper, the circulator shall indicate the number of signatures contained on it, and shall sign a statement made under penalty of election falsification that the circulator witnessed the affixing of every signature...."

As you are aware, a Primary Election will take place on May 3, 2022. The plan is to mail out a Voter Information Guide to all registered voters for this election—approximately 800,000 voters.

The Voter Information Guide includes the following information:

- What's included on the ballot;
- Voters will be required to select a Democratic, Republican or non-partisan party ballot;
- How to view a sample ballot online;
- General information on current CDC and health and safety guidelines being followed;
- How to request a Vote-By-Mail application;
- Early In-Person voting dates and hours at the Board of Elections;
- The voter's Election Day poll location and voting hours;
- Identification requirements for voting on Election Day;

Early In-Person voting begins on Tuesday, April 5, 2022. **The voter information guide will be mailed approximately one week before early voting begins.**

An unrestricted, informal bid was conducted through the Cuyahoga County's procurement system, INFOR, to 40 registered suppliers. The bid closed on Tuesday, February 22, 2022 at 11:00am EST. There was one successful bid from **Angstrom Graphics Inc Midwest** for a total of **\$41,872.00** for the printing and mailing of the Voter Information Guides.

Thank you for your ongoing business and for the trust you place in Midwest Direct as a key supplier in your ballot production.

We are reaching out to you today to share our concerns about the unusual and concerning cost increases we are facing in all areas of our business. Our goal today, and always, is to be transparent with you regarding our relationship.

Throughout the pandemic and the following financial and work place challenges, Midwest Direct has taken many extraordinary steps to mitigate the impact of increasing costs in materials and work force – all while our essential workers continued daily services to support your business. We have been monitoring the supply as well as the upwards trending prices. In efforts to maintain profitability as well as availability we have been ordering paper and materials well in advance. At this current time, we have enough materials to support Cuyahoga County Board of Elections through 1.5-2 full county wide elections. This however has come at a significant cost.

The industry in general is being impacted by availability and:

- Increases in raw material costs of paper, ink and envelopes
- Coordinating the purchase of envelopes and paper due to the increased lead times at the mills and converters
- The current state of the transportation industry and increased fuel prices

We find ourselves in an unfamiliar position of requesting your assistance with a modest increase. Prices for materials have increased from \$134.96/m to \$173.70/m. We have absorbed the paper price increase, but are asking for any level of assistance you can provide on the 33% increase on the envelopes.

We understand that there may be no options to assist us, but thank you for the partnership and relationship that allows us to ask for any consideration. Regardless of your decision, Midwest ensures you we will provide the requirements of our contract.

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New Business

Key Changes to the Election Official Manual

Chapter 2 – Board of Elections Organization and Operations (Directive 2022-06)

Section 2.01 – The Board of Elections

- All Board Members, Directors and Deputy Directors are required to participate in the SOS annual summer conference in-person, virtually, or by watching a recording of the conference published soon after its completion.

Chapter 4 – Voter Registration (Directive 2022-08)

Section 4.01 - Definitions

- Added a section titled Voter-Initiated Activity listing what qualifies as voter-initiated activity:
 - Voting;
 - Submitting an absentee application;
 - Register to vote;
 - Updating or confirming an address with the BOE or BMV or;
 - Signing a candidate or issue petition that is verified by the BOE.

Section 4.04 – Processing Voter Registration Forms

- In the section titled Acknowledgement Card for Valid Registration these two sentences were added: *One month before cancelling any record, the board must mail Form 255-A-3 to the address on file for the record. If the voter responds to the notice and confirms their address, the board must change the voter's status to an active-active status and mail the voter an acknowledgment notice.*

Section 4.07 – Bureau of Motor Vehicles Voter Registration Transactions

- If a board receives a completed (NCOA Supplemental) Return Notice with a new address outside of Ohio, the board must cancel the voter's registration in that county (not mail Form 10-A so the elector may cancel their own registration as was the previous practice).

Section 4.14 – Statewide Voter Registration System

- In the section titled Voter History, it adds the following under the provisional bullet:
 - If a provisional ballot affirmation is used to register an individual to vote, the newly registered voter must be assigned voter history for casting a provisional ballot.

Chapter 11 – Post-Election Activities (Directive 2022-15)

Section 11.03 – Post-Election Audit Procedures

- Under the section Timeline, there is direction on when an audit can begin. In short, if there is no recount, the audit may start six days after the official results are certified and must be completed by the 21st day after certification. If there is a recount, the audit must begin immediately after the Board certifies the recount and completed within 14 days. Boards have five days after completion of the audit to **certify** the results. We are only mandated to certify results of **required** audits.

Chapter 12 – Voting Systems (Directive 2022-16)

Section 12.01 - Definitions

- A new item was added to the section titled Testing and Certification of Electronic Pollbooks called “Communication.” It details the restrictions on transmitting data, what is permissible and what is prohibited, etc. This supports our current practices with electronic pollbooks.

Chapter 13 – Petitions (Directive 2022-17)

Section 13.03 – Circulator Statements

- As expected, changes were made to the Signature Undercounting section (page 366). Two main takeaways:
 1. *Petitions may be filed where the number of signatures reported in the circulator's statement is less than the total number of uncrossed-out signatures submitted on the part-petition.*
 2. *No board may invalidate a part-petition solely because a circulator statement includes a number that is lower than the number of signatures it actually contains, so long as there is no indication of fraud or material misrepresentation.*

Policies Added to the Election Official Manual in 2022

Signature Stamps

- *Chapter 2, Section 2.02* (page 30) We must adopt a **policy** governing when a signature stamp (for both Board Members and the Director/Deputy Director) may be used and who may access/use the signature stamps. *Chapter 8, Section 10.02* (page 307) says we may not use digital or stamped signatures for Unofficial Summary Reports.

Online Publication

- *Chapter 2, Section 2.02* (page 49) We should adopt a **policy** to post any information that would be in a legal notice, emergency changes to polling locations, etc., on both our website and social media. These are in addition to, not a replacement for, legal obligations to post in a newspaper of general circulation.

Public Records Request

- *Chapter 2, Section 2.02* (page 50) We are required to create and adopt a **policy** for responding to public records requests. We are to work with our county prosecutor and use the Sunshine Law Manual as a reference tool.

Testing Voting Equipment and Ballots

- *Chapter 5, Section 5.08* (pages 154-157) We must have a **policy**, approved by the Board, for the bipartisan testing of all voting equipment and ballots. This section of the EOM provides the minimum requirements.

Scanning of Curbside Ballots

- *Chapter 7, Section 7.04* (page 205) We should scan curbside ballots in the same manner as ballots placed in an emergency slot and should adopt a **policy** that determines whether such ballots are scanned centrally or in the polling location.

Post-Election Audit Procedures

- *Chapter 11, Section 11.03* (page 344) We should consider either designating staff that would handle ballots during an Audit at a Board meeting before the election (and have those names reflected in the Minutes) or adopt a **policy** designating which employees may handle a ballot during an Audit.

Outsourcing Required Mailings Other Than Absentee Ballots

- *Chapter 2, Section 2.02* (page 47) We must create a **policy** that details the steps for utilizing a print and mailing vendor to produce and mail required notices other than absentee ballots. The minimum requirements of this policy are outlined in this section of the EOM, which include entering into a contract with the vendor that is reviewed by the county prosecutor.
