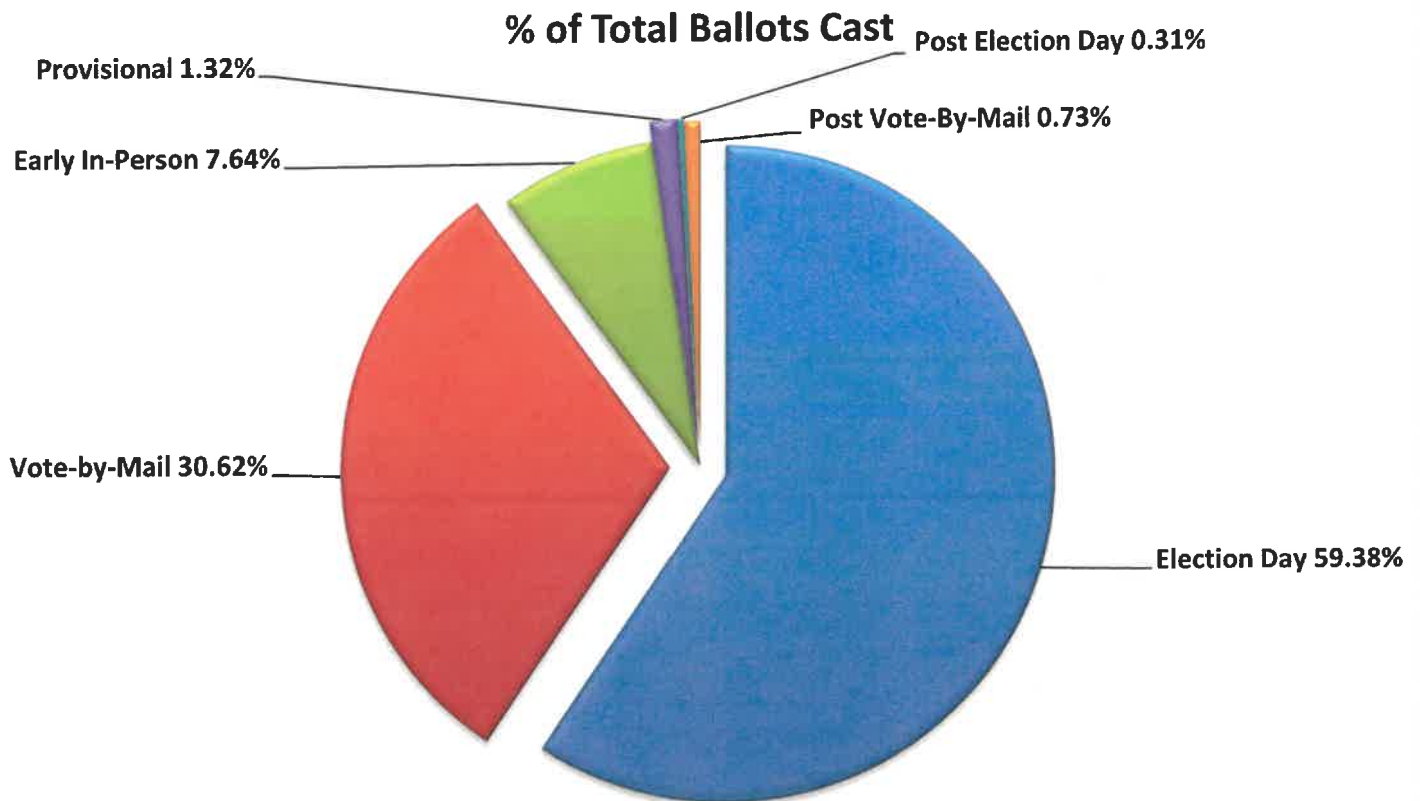

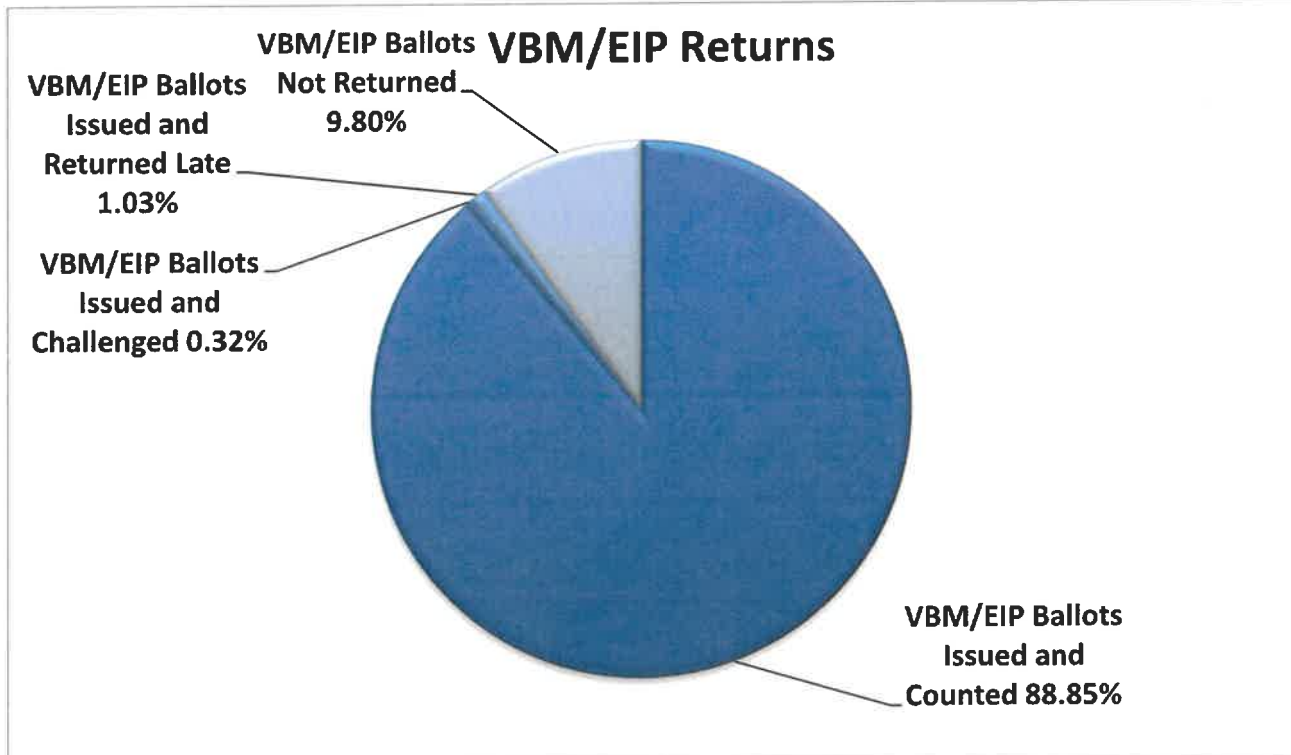

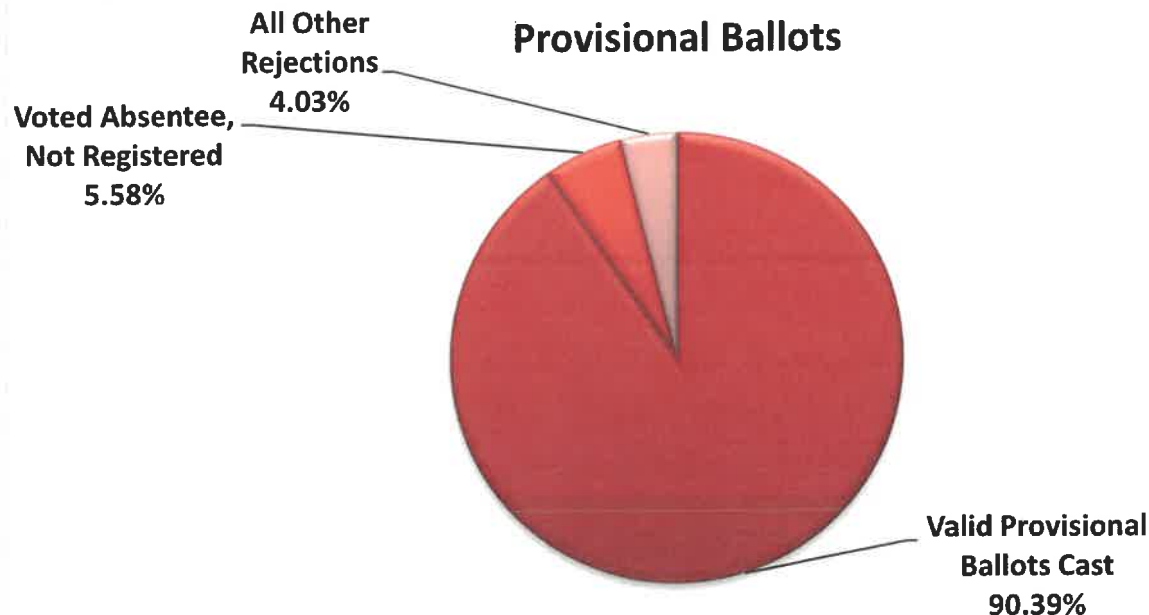


PROVISIONAL VOTING SUMMARY

A total of 1,093 Provisional Ballots were cast during the August 3, 2021 Special Congressional Primary Election. There were 774 on Election Day at polling locations and 319 during Early In-Person Voting. Of those ballots, 988 (90.39%) were valid and tabulated by the Ballot Department. There were 105 invalid Provisional Ballots, resulting in a 9.61%* rejection rate for this election.

*The Provisional Rejection Rate is 4.03% when provisional voters who have already cast a VBM Ballot or are Not Registered are excluded.

Final Ballot Order

The following is the proposed ballot order for the September 14, 2021 Primary Election. The administration has reviewed and revised the order considering future filing deadlines and changes in voter registration.

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections Election Day proposed ballot order is based upon 60% of active voters for nonpartisan ballots, 101% of registered voters affiliated with the Democratic Party for Democratic ballots (for East Cleveland), and compared those numbers vs. 115% of the total turnout from the November 2018 and November 2019 General Elections. The higher of the two numbers was selected for each precinct.

Additionally, 50 ballots from each party for each precinct were ordered for Early In-Person voting. A Nursing Home order was placed based on the number of registered voters for both parties at each nursing home located within the precinct. For Hospital voting, 10 ballots from each precinct were ordered.

Background

- On August 4, 2021 the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections received a Member of Council candidacy filing for the Village of Highland Hills from Cynthia D. Beard.
- The candidate's petition was valid and contained 14 valid signatures. The minimum number of required valid signatures is 10.
- The candidate ***has been*** certified to the November 2, 2021 General Election.
- Mr. Goodwin is a *qualified elector* in the Village of Highland Hills and is *eligible* to bring forth said protest.

Protest: (Exhibit A)

- Mr. Goodwin alleges that Ms. Beard on or about January 1, 2020 took occupancy at 3720 Northfield Road, Apt 104, Highland Hills; owned by the Village of Highland Hills.
- He further alleges that Ms. Beard has not lived at her primary and registration address of 20704 Alameda Parkway for a number of years.
- That Ms. Beard filed petitions using the improper address of 20704 Alameda Parkway.
- Upon information and belief, Ms. Beard has lived in Maple Hts. as her primary residence for several years prior to January 1, 2020, thus Ms. Beard has not resided continuously for two years preceding the election per the Villages charter.

- Highland Hills Charter Article V Nominations, Election, and Qualifications – Section 2 – Qualifications of Officers

SECTION 2. QUALIFICATION OF OFFICERS.

“Each elective officer of the Municipality shall be a qualified elector of the Municipality, shall have resided continuously therein not less than two years next preceding such officer's election and shall continue to reside therein during such officer's term of office....”

Voter Registration Overview: (Exhibit C)

- April 18, 1994 - Ms. Beard has been continuously registered to vote at 20704 Alameda Parkway, Highland Hills.

Observations:

- Ms. Beard was a candidate on the November 2019 ballot and stated her residence as 20704 Alameda Parkway, Highland Hills on her petition filing.
- No protest was filed against her 2019 candidacy.
- Ms. Beard was elected to Highland Hills Council in November 2019 and took office on January 1, 2020 as a Member of Council.
- Highland Hills Charter Article II Council Section 3 states in part “Council shall be the judge of the election and qualification of its own members...”
- As Council President, one would assume that if Mr. Goodwin had/has concerns that Ms. Beard lived in Maple Heights for several years prior to 2020 that those concerns would have been addressed by Council before allowing her to take her seat on Council in January 2020.
- Three candidates have filed for Member of Council for the November 2021 election: Mr. Goodwin, Ms. Beard and Ms. Pride. Electors vote for two.

I am a resident of Highland Hills for the last 30 years. I am currently duly elected as a member of Council of Highland Hills Village Council and voted by my peers as Council President. I am a candidate for re-election to Council at the November 2, 2021 general election in Highland Hills.

I am protesting the candidacy of Cynthia Beard who has filed petitions to be a candidate for Council of the Village of Highland Hills, Cuyahoga County, Ohio in the general election to be held on November 2, 2021. My reasons for this protest are as follows:

1. Ms. Beard has registered to vote from residential address 20704 Alameda Parkway, Highland Hills, Ohio since 1994.
2. Ms. Beard's voting record shows she voted from this address from 1994 to 2020.
3. In December, 2019, Ms. Beard filed an application with Highland Hills seeking to rent an apartment at 3720 Northfield Road, Apartment 104, Highland Hills, Ohio, owned by Highland Hills..
4. Ms. Beard took occupancy of that apartment on or about January 1, 2020 and has remained a resident of that address/apartment since about January 1, 2020 to the present.
5. Ms. Beard has not changed her registered voting residence to her current primary residence at 3720 Northfield Road.
6. Ms. Beard filed petitions to be a candidate using an improper address of 20704 Alameda Parkway, Highland Hills, Ohio.
7. Ms. Beard has not lived at 20704 Alameda Parkway as her primary address for a number of years.
8. Upon information and belief, Ms. Beard has lived in Maple Hts. as her primary residence for several years prior to January 1, 2020.
9. Article V, Section 2 of the Highland Hills Charter states: "Each elective officer of the Municipality shall be a qualified elector of the Municipality, shall have resided continuously therein not less than two years next preceding such officer's election and shall continue to reside therein during such officer's term of office."
10. Ms. Beard has not lived in Highland Hills for two years prior to the election to be held in November, 2021.

In addition to the information I am able to provide, a number of residents who live on Alameda Parkway are available to testify to Ms. Beard's residence status at Alameda Parkway during the last several years.

Ms. Beard will be unable to establish that her primary residence during the minimum time frame required by the Highland Hills Charter was Alameda Parkway or Shaker House, 3720 Northfield Road.

For these reasons, Ms. Beard's candidacy for Council of the Village of Highland Hills at the November 2, 2021 election should be denied.

I received via email, but not a certified copy of the Board of Elections notice of protest regarding my candidacy for the November 2nd General Election. I plan to be at the hearing August 23, 2021.

I have served on Highland Hills Council since 2020. As Chair of Highland Hills Rules Committee, at our last meeting, I informed Council of my intention to address issues relating to residency requirements. After this meeting, our Law Director Tom O'Donnell informed me he had been investigating legalities of my election in 2019 and would continue to do so. I brought the matter to the attention of the Board of Elections and decided to file a petition for the upcoming election to bring closure to the issues and investigation. I have little interest in serving politically, other than serving the very small community where I was raised. I also want to make sure that residents are engaged in their community affairs and not intimidated from participating in community governance.

I hope our Council President's protest is not only to insure a simple campaign in November, but to also insure that these are not lingering issues that negatively impact our wonderful Village, while someone in the Village questions my election or appearance on the ballot.

- 1) I first registered to vote the year I graduated High School 1981, as strongly advocated by my much loved Warrensville Heights High School Civics teachers.
- 2) I believe I may have voted from another location between 1994 & 2020, but I was mostly concerned and aware of the issues in our small community, and generally voted at Highland Hill's very convenient polling place. You may check my voting history; I never intended to run for office, but I am committed to participating in the political process and generally vote.
- 3) Correct.
- 4) I took occupancy of the Village Apartment by the end of December.
- 5) Correct. I inquired about this and was not told it was necessary to change my registered voting address. With the recent August 3rd Special Election, as an elected official I considered changing to the Apartment address, but believe that would have caused greater confusion, and was advised to vote with my current and "permanent" address. 20704 Alameda is my family home, I expected to return to.
- 6) I sought the counsel of Petitions and Elections staff prior to obtaining and submitting a candidate petition. Initially, I had two Highland Hills addresses on my petition, and learned it would invalidate signatures on my 2021 Petition.

- 7) Ms. Beard has not lived at 20704 Alameda Parkway as her primary residence since December 2020.
- 8) Ms. Beard lived in Maple Hts. 1998-2003.
- 9) Article V, Section 2 is attached.
- 10) Councilwoman Beard was duly elected in 2019 as a long-time resident of Highland Hills at 20704 Alameda Pkwy. Upon election, I assumed primary residence in Village Hall Apartments at 3720 Northfield Road, and had full rent amount withdrawn from monthly Council Compensation (\$10,000 annually) and paid deposit and fees as all other residents.

Can't wait to see what neighbors are able to keep track of my comings and goings when I can hardly do so myself. In deciding to run for office for the first time, I was referred to the Charter of Highland Hills and believe I met the requirements. I also sought counsel from others.

Article V Section 2
Qualification of Officers

SECTION 2. QUALIFICATION OF OFFICERS.

Each elective officer of the Municipality shall be a qualified elector of the Municipality, shall have resided continuously therein not less than two years next preceding such officer's election and shall continue to reside therein during such officer's term of office. Any person eligible to be a member of Council shall not have a family member holding an elected office for the Village of Highland Hills nor have a family member nominated for and/or appointed to an elected office in the Village of Highland Hills. For this section, "family" is consanguinity or affinity of the second degree which includes spouse, parents, children, siblings, grandparents, and grandchildren. Each elected official shall hold no other elective public office during such officer's term, neither shall such officer hold any other public employment incompatible with elective office in this Municipality during such term except as otherwise provided in this Charter, and further excepting the office of notary public and membership in the militia or reserve corps. The Council shall determine whether any public employment is incompatible with an elective office in this Municipality.

No officer of this Municipality, elective or otherwise, shall have a financial interest in any contract with or expenditures of money by this Municipality other than such office's fixed compensation and for expenses of travel provided in Section 3 of Article IX. Such interests shall disqualify such officer from holding office, in addition to the other penalties provided by law.

Every officer of this Municipality shall, before assuming the duties of any office, take and subscribe an oath or affirmation to support the Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of Ohio and faithfully, honestly and impartially to discharge the duties of the office, and shall give such bond as may be required by Council.

Removal of Members

SECTION 3. REMOVAL OF MEMBERS.

Council shall be the judge of the election and qualification of its own members. Any member may be removed for gross misconduct, malfeasance in or disqualification for office, or for gross neglect of duty in office; or for the conviction while in office of a crime involving moral turpitude, or if adjudicated by a court of competent jurisdiction to be legally incompetent, or for a violation of the oath of office, or for persistent failure to abide by the rules of Council or if absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings of Council, without such absence being authorized by an affirmative vote of three (3) of the remaining members of Council.

Removal for such grounds shall not take place without the unanimous vote of the remaining four (4) other members of Council and until the accused shall have been notified in writing by certified mail of the charge(s) at least fifteen (15) days in advance of a public hearing upon such charge(s). The accused member shall not vote on the removal. (Amended 11-3-20)

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Executive Summary and Highlights

The 2022 and 2023 recommended biennial budget is sufficient for the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) to effectively provide election services to all voters, candidates, committees, and political subdivisions in Cuyahoga County, which has 880,000 registered voters – the most out of any county in the State of Ohio.

In recent years the CCBOE has seen an increase in voter participation outside of Presidential Election years. This positive voter trend is expected to continue in the two (2) known elections in 2022 and three (3) known elections in 2023. In addition to overall increased voter participation, more voters are opting to vote by mail or by early in-person voting at the CCBOE.

The 2020 Presidential Elections were like no other elections the CCBOE has ever administered. The CCBOE was fortunate in being awarded various grants to assist with the unexpected and voluminous expenses, workload and challenges associated with executing large elections in a pandemic. When possible, the CCBOE expended grant dollars to acquire hardware and software that benefited voters and election officials in 2020 and will continue to provide these benefits for years to come. In time, many of these advancements will reduce seasonal temporary employee staffing and wage costs. Grant expenditures have resulted in:

- Online precinct election official training
- Introduction of automation equipment to enhance Vote-by-Mail ballot processing
- Providing ADA accessible sample ballots to voters

The CCBOE's 2022-2023 Recommended Biennial Budget includes an additional \$1,422,574 to maintain paying Election Day Field Staff wages at the November 2020 rates, \$788,708 to increase Seasonal Temporary Employee wages from \$11.25 (2018) and \$11.50 (2019) per hour to \$15 per hour, and \$226,644 to implement the Employee Compensation Market Study for Full-Time permanent employees.

Per ORC Section 3501.17, the CCBOE charges back subdivisions for the wages incurred by election day workers in odd number years and returns those funds to the County general fund.

In addition to wage increases for the staff necessary to conduct all elections, the budget also includes an additional \$345,200 to cover the ongoing maintenance and licensing fees needed to support election administration and voter enhancements realized from the purchase of equipment and software with grant dollars in 2020.

An additional \$200,000 was included in the Administration Budget to fund ongoing maintenance projects (non-routine) that are necessary to maintain a safe environment for staff and the public in our aging buildings.

The CCBOE will make a major purchase of new voting equipment during this biennial budget cycle. \$10.4 Million will be covered with State of Ohio capital funds provided for in SB 135. However, there will be ancillary items needed to support the new voting equipment that will require County funding. The ancillary purchases should equate to a small percentage (<10%) compared to the State's \$10.4M contribution. See *Part 3: New Initiatives* for additional information. Because a vendor has not been selected yet, the request for funding voting equipment Table B items was not included in this recommended budget.

Part I

Introduction

Background

The Board of Elections is responsible for conducting all official elections in Cuyahoga County, as well as for maintaining the voter registration records of the County's registered voters and the campaign finance reports of all local candidates and political committees. With around 880,000 registered voters, Cuyahoga County is one of the **largest election jurisdictions** in the State of Ohio.

The Board of Elections consists of **four Board Members**—two Republicans and two Democrats—who are appointed by the Ohio Secretary of State to serve four-year terms. Board Members are responsible for ensuring that the agency's duties are carried out in accordance with state and federal law, as well as in accordance with the instructions of the Secretary of State and the policies adopted by the Board Members.

The Board Members appoint a **Director** and **Deputy Director** who must be of the opposite political party and are responsible for the day-to-day operations of the agency. In addition to the Director and Deputy Director, the full-time staff of the Board of Elections includes **89 full-time employees** who serve at the pleasure of the Board Members. Full-time employees are divided into the following **ten departments**:

Ballot Preparation & Tabulation	Prepares ballots for elections and is responsible for ballot tabulation and election results. Tests all election equipment to ensure proper operation on Election Day. Process Vote by Mail ballot application requests and Vote by Mail ballot returns, including voters confined to nursing homes and hospitals.
Candidate & Petition Services	Assists candidates, political subdivisions, or any entity that wishes to have an item placed on the ballot. Processes petition filings for municipalities, candidates, and issues. Accepts, files, and audits campaign finance reports. Facilitates early in-person voting.
Community Outreach	Primary liaison with media and news organizations. Promotes voter registration and provides voter education and information at locations and events throughout Cuyahoga County and via online and social media.
Election Officials	Recruits, hires, and trains all election officials and Election Day workers according to Ohio Law.
Election Support	Responsible for voting location selection and assuring accessibility for all voters. Prepares and delivers voting equipment and supplies to voting locations prior to each election.
Executive Office	Includes the Director, Deputy Director, Elections and Compliance Administrator, and support staff.
Fiscal Services	Manages the budget, accounts payable, contracts, procurement, payroll, and overall building operations.
Human Resources	Manages recruiting, screening, interviewing, and placing Board of Elections full-time, part-time, and temporary staff. Administers comprehensive personnel program.
Information Systems	Manages voter registration database and the Board of Elections website. Draws precinct boundaries according to Ohio law. Ensures voters are assigned to their correct precincts. Provides technical support to all departments. Supports and complies with cyber security initiatives enforced by the Ohio Secretary of State.
Registration	Processes voter registration cards. Verifies signatures on petitions for candidates and issues. Mail voter-registration-related notifications. Maintains and updates voter history after each election (party affiliation and voting activity).

Elections in 2022 and 2023

The Board of Elections will conduct two countywide elections in 2022 and three elections (two local and one countywide) in 2023. Additional special elections for various purposes may also be needed.

May 3, 2022 Gubernatorial Primary Election

This **countywide** election will include party nominations for federal, state, and local offices. Voter turnout in Cuyahoga County was **23.8%** for the last Gubernatorial Primary Election in 2018 and was **21.1%** for the 2014 Gubernatorial Primary Election.

November 8, 2022 Gubernatorial General Election

This **countywide** election will include candidates for the federal, state, and local offices that are nominated in the Primary Election. Voter turnout in Cuyahoga County was **54.5%** for the last Gubernatorial General Election in 2018 and was **39.6%** for the 2014 Gubernatorial General Election.

May 2, 2023 Primary Election

This **local** election will include nominations for local offices in some municipalities and municipal court districts, if required, and can also include local issues such as charter amendments and tax levies. Below are the size and voter turnout for previous odd-year primary elections held in May:

- 2021: 196 precincts (**20.0%** of the county), **18.9%** voter turnout
- 2019: 175 precincts (**17.9%** of the county), **21.2%** voter turnout
- 2017: 205 precincts (**21.0%** of the county), **22.7%** voter turnout

September 12, 2023 Primary Election

This **local** election will include nominations for local offices in some municipalities and municipal court districts, if required, and can also include local issues such as charter amendments and tax levies. Below are the size and voter turnout for the September primary election in 2019:

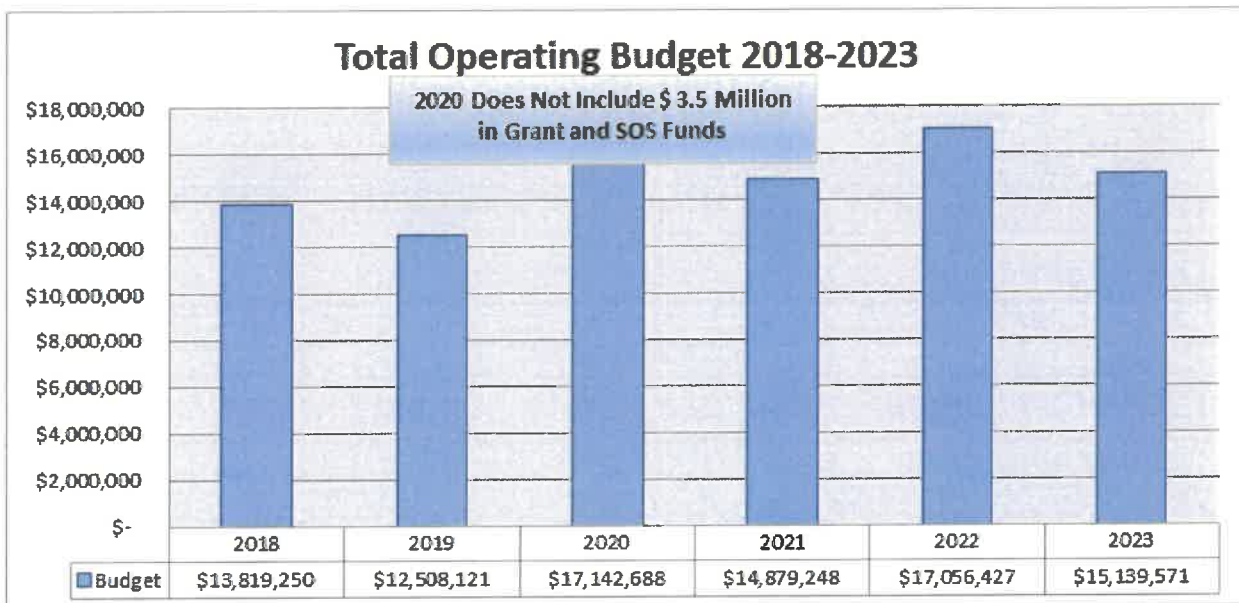
- 2019: 44 Precincts (**4.5%** of the county), **11%** voter turnout

November 7, 2023 General Election

This **countywide** election will include candidates for local offices in municipalities, school districts, and municipal court districts. Voter turnout in Cuyahoga County was **26.2%** in the 2019 General Election and was **38.4%** in the 2015 General Election.

Impact of Four-Year Election Cycle

The total recommended budget of \$17.1 million for 2022, a gubernatorial election year, is an increase of \$3.2 million (23%) from 2018, the last gubernatorial election year. The total recommended budget of \$15.1 million for 2023, a municipal election year, is an increase of \$2.6 million (21%) from 2019. Please note, the 2019 municipal election year did not have a City of Cleveland Primary Election. The nature of the CCBOE's business model causes the upcoming budgets to be based on both the previous year's budget as well as the similar election budget from four years prior.



The yearly fluctuations in the operating budget displayed in the chart above are mostly due to the varying size of the elections (i.e., turnout and total precincts) conducted within a given year. Also, in 2020 the CCBOE was fortunate to receive grant awards from third-party organizations, additional funding from the SOS and grant funds from the County Executive's Office totaling just over \$3.5 million. This additional 20% in funding from outside sources provided the CCBOE with \$20.6 million dollars to conduct successful elections in the 2020 Presidential Election cycles. The \$20.6 million dollars is an increase of 30% over the \$15.8 million that was needed to conduct the 2016 Presidential Elections.

The \$14.8 million the CCBOE will spend this year is a 21% increase from the \$12.2 million spent in 2017 to conduct elections.

The annual percentage increases in the 2022-2023 biennium budget recommendations are consistent with the percentage increases the CCBOE has witnessed in the recent past. The landscape and requirements for conducting safe, fair and transparent elections has changed.

The increase or decrease in turnout and total precincts generally corresponds to the **four-year election cycle** described below.

Budget Overview by Category

As indicated in the chart below, full-time staff payroll and benefits represent approximately half of the budget in both 2022 and 2023. An additional third of the budget consists of funding for election officials, ballot printing, and temporary staff.

Other significant budget categories include county building service charge backs (security, custodial, and maintenance) for the Board of Elections Building, postage and mailing services, county lease and utility chargebacks for the Halle Warehouse, paper and printed materials, voting equipment maintenance, and election-related rentals or other services.

The CCBOE utilized grant funds in 2020 to increase the stipend paid to Precinct Election Officials (PEO) and Voting Location Managers (VLM) from \$172.00 to \$250 and \$200 to \$275 respectively. This was the most effective tool to recruit the statutorially required numbers of PEOs and VLMs to work on election day. The CCBOE has returned to paying the pre-2020 stipend amounts to PEOs and VLMs and is having difficulties recruiting the necessary numbers of PEOs and VLMs in 2021. It is approximately a 20-hour commitment to serve as a PEO or VLM between training and working the polls. The CCBOE also created the position of Sanitation Official to focus on keeping polling locations sanitized and believes this position is still needed during this biennium budget cycle.

The CCBOE also utilized grant funds in 2020 to increase the hourly rate of seasonal temporary employees from \$11.50 to \$12.50. The CCBOE more than doubles the size of its workforce during countywide elections and cannot execute the necessary administrative job functions without this increase in workforce. The CCBOE is encountering challenges in meeting its seasonal temporary employee needs and retaining tenured temporary employees because of the hourly rate paid. The current hourly rate of \$11.50 is not competitive with the external job market. In particular the CCBOE competes with retail establishments for employees with retailers paying up to \$15.00 per hour which is 30% more than the CCBOE.

These two items account for the largest increases in the CCBOE budget proposal.

Budget Accounting Units

The operating budget for the Board of Elections is divided into the five budget accounting units listed below.

Appropriated funds **cannot** be transferred from one accounting unit to another unless approved by the County Council.

Further, appropriated funds for personnel (payroll and benefits) **cannot** be transferred to non - personnel categories within the same accounting unit (and vice versa) unless approved by County Council.

Part 2

Budget Summary

Budget Overview by Accounting Unit and Category (2018-2023)

Presented below is the recommended operating budget for 2022 and 2023 compared to actual and projected expenditures for 2018 to 2021. The budget is broken down by both accounting unit and category.

The Election Administration Budget provides funding for salaries and fringe benefits of the 91 full-time staff and 4 Board members of the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections, as well as building maintenance, lease agreements and other non-election specific operational services.

The current budget proposal includes a 2% Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for full-time employees at a cost of \$99,665 in salaries and \$39,866 in benefits for 2022 and \$101,556 in salaries and \$40,622 in benefits for 2023. The budget also includes a statutory salary increase of 1.75% for each Board Member. The increase in funding to full-time staff payroll also includes approximately \$160,000 for retirement vacation payouts for the nine (9) employees eligible to retire during the 2022-2023 budget cycle. Unused funds will be returned to the County general fund.

The lease of the Halle Warehouse space appears in this section at a cost of \$540,114 in 2022 and \$556,176 in 2023. Additional County Building Charges at both BOE buildings for utilities, custodial services, security, etc., are projected at \$955,955 per year.

For the first time, a \$100,000 per year allowance is being included for building Maintenance Projects, performed by Public Works' staff, to address non-routine building repairs and other small projects to improve the building work environment (i.e., new water fountains).

An additional \$100,000 is also included for ongoing Cybersecurity Enhancements. The CCBOE has strong cybersecurity protocols in place and will utilize the new funding for routine enhancements required by the Department of Homeland Security and Secretary of State.

The remaining items in the Election Administration Budget include administrative postage and mailing services, printed materials, vehicle maintenance, supplies, and other miscellaneous business costs. In addition to routine inflationary cost increases, we are also providing better services to the public such as ADA accessible sample ballots and voting location change letters as opposed to postcards.

Funding for the Primary Election Budget is based on one countywide election in 2022 for the statewide gubernatorial partisan primary, and two local municipal primary elections in 2023.

A proposed raise in wages for office temporary staff and election day officials/workers accounts for an increase in the Primary Election Budget compared to past years. Other items including voting location costs, paper and printed materials, and postage costs are seeing slight increases.

It should be noted, most costs associated with the Primary Election Budget are charged back to the subdivisions within Cuyahoga County in odd numbered years (in accordance with Ohio Election Law). This includes the costs of ballots, temporary staff, election day officials/workers, and postage costs. The money will be returned to the Cuyahoga County General Fund. In essence, the increased funding requests for PEO and VLM stipends, seasonal temporary employee wages and polling location rental fees in 2023 are cost neutral on the Cuyahoga County General Fund.

During even numbered years, only the cost of ballots and advertising will be charged back to subdivisions placing an issue on the ballot.

Other items including voting location costs, paper and printed materials, and postage costs are seeing slight increases.

It should be noted, most costs associated with the General Election Budget are charged back to the subdivisions within Cuyahoga County in odd numbered years (in accordance with Ohio Election Law). This includes the costs of ballots, temporary staff, election day officials/workers, and postage costs. The money will be returned to the Cuyahoga County General Fund. No funds will be requested for special elections in 2022 or 2023.

Since special elections are infrequent, small, and revenue-neutral—the Board of Elections will request appropriations for special elections on an **as-needed** basis in 2022 and 2023 if a special election is required. This approach will allow the County to divert financial resources elsewhere that would otherwise be reserved for special elections that may not be needed. The CCBOE conducted one (1) special election in 2020 and three (3) special elections in 2021. Requesting the funds on an as needed basis worked well.

It should be noted, special election costs are charged back entirely to the subdivisions holding a special election and the money returned to the Cuyahoga County General Fund.

The overall funding increases by 22% in 2022 and remains flat for 2023. Almost all of the additional expenses are attributed to new software and equipment implemented in 2020 with grant funding to administer the Presidential Elections cycles. The CCBOE utilized the grant funds to cover the ongoing maintenance and licensing in 2021. The CCBOE and voters realized positive enhancements from these new products that need to continue through the next budget cycle and beyond.

The two largest annual costs are for the ES&S voting equipment and Tenex electronic pollbook maintenance and licensing agreements.

New Initiatives

New Initiatives

Listed below are new initiatives for 2022 and 2023 that will impact the operating budget for the Board of Elections.

Election Equipment Maintenance and Licensing
2022: \$148,600
2023: \$148,600
The CCBOE received multiple grant awards in 2020 to improve administrative processes in a pandemic election environment. The CCBOE put emphasis on procuring equipment and software systems that not only enhanced operations in 2020 but would improve operations for several years into the future. The CCBOE also used the grant funding to cover the routine annual maintenance costs in 2021. With the one-time purchase of equipment and installation expenses already covered, the CCBOE has included ongoing maintenance and licensing fees for various products that enhance processes such as the Vote-by-Mail program and online Precinct Election Official training.
Seasonal Temporary Employee Wages
2022: \$471,275
2023: \$399,350 (This amount will be charged back to each subdivision)
The CCBOE relies on seasonal temporary employees to execute the numerous processes in election administration. Where once the CCBOE wage rate for these employees was market competitive, it now lags the compensation rate of multiple retail establishments. It has been difficult to recruit new employees and retain existing seasonal temporary employees who can find higher wages in businesses closer to where they reside. Employee retention is critical to maintain institutional knowledge in our operations. The CCBOE intends to increase the hourly rate from \$11.50 to \$15.00 per hour effective January 1, 2022.
Election Day Field Staff Wages
2022: \$709,880
2023: \$467,694 (This amount will be charged back to each subdivision)
The CCBOE employs approximately 5,000 individuals in each countywide election to work at polling locations and in the field on the election day. Most of these individuals are Precinct Election Officials (PEOs) who receive a lump sum stipend that covers their time in training, setting up for the voting location on election eve, and working on election day. Apart from the November 2020 General Election, most PEOs have been compensated \$172 for the past 10+ years. For the November 2020 General Election, the stipend was temporarily increased to \$250. This was the primary reason for the CCBOE being able to employ PEOs for the Presidential General Election. Now, it is difficult to recruit PEOs for the lower stipend of \$172. Going forward, the CCBOE wants to compensate all election day employees at the November 2020 General Election rates to ensure statutory staffing requirements are met and compensate the staff near the \$15.00 per hour rate.

New Initiatives (Cont.)

Private Polling Location Rental Fee
2022: \$40,000
2023: \$20,000 (This amount will be charged back to each subdivision)
The CCBOE currently utilizes about 300 polling locations to conduct voting on election day. Of these about 100 polling locations are owned by private or non-profit entities with the remaining 200 being public buildings (e.g. school, city hall, etc.). Maintaining continuity in polling location assignments is key in the CCBOE's efforts to minimize voter confusion on election day. The CCBOE currently pays the non-public polling locations a \$300 rental fee which is becoming an insufficient rental fee for several locations. The CCBOE plans to increase the rental fee from \$300 to \$500.
Off-Site Retention Material Storage
2022: \$22,000
2023: \$22,000
The CCBOE is required to retain election materials from federal elections for 22-months pursuant to the Secretary of State's Retention Schedule. This includes voted and unvoted ballots, Vote-by-Mail envelopes, and various other election specific items. The August 3, 2021 Special Congressional Election and November 2, 2021 General Election are unexpected federal elections that the CCBOE does not have onsite storage available to comply with SOS retention requirements. The CCBOE will need to rent or lease an offsite facility for these materials until they can be destroyed in 2023.
Maintenance Projects
2022: \$100,000
2023: \$100,000
The CCBOE's buildings are aging and in need of ongoing maintenance updates in addition to larger capital improvement projects. Adding a specific budget line item for building maintenance facilitates the CCBOE being proactive in planning building maintenance instead of it being a reactive measure to building infrastructure failures.
Cybersecurity Enhancements
2022: \$50,000
2023: \$50,000
The CCBOE is defined as critical infrastructure by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). The Secretary of State's and DHS' ever increasing cybersecurity requirements impose unexpected cybersecurity requirements on our systems. The CCBOE needs to procure a data backup device with support in preparation for the next round of cybersecurity initiatives.

New Initiatives (Cont.)

Employee Compensation Study

2022: \$112,200

2023: \$114,444

The CCBOE contracted with the Archer Company to conduct a comprehensive maintenance review of our compensation and classification structure. The Archer Company identified multiple job classifications that require a salary adjustment. The last salary update at the Board of Elections was performed in 2015.

Voting Equipment

2022: TBD

2023: TBD

In 2018, Senate Bill 135 made funds available for all 88 counties to purchase new voting equipment. The CCBOE has been awarded \$10.4 million toward the acquisition of new equipment. The CCBOE is in regular discussions with the Secretary of State's Office regarding purchase and implementation timelines. It is likely vendor selection will occur in 2022 with implementation and invoicing occurring in 2023.

The State has classified the voting equipment into two categories, Table A Items and Table B Items. The \$10.4 million equipment allotment can be used for Table A Items only. This covers most of the equipment needed and includes items such as Election Day scanners, central count ballot scanners, and ADA voting equipment. The CCBOE will also need to purchase some Table B Items. These could include needed ancillary items such as transport carts, additional staff training, and storage shelving. The funds needed to cover the Table B Item expenses is not known at this time as it is directly dependent on the voting equipment vendor that is selected.

Major Capital Projects

2022: TBD

2023: TBD

Major Capital Projects to the buildings occupied by the CCBOE are typically not funded through the biennial budget process. However, the current condition of the buildings and operational needs to execute successful elections warrant mention in this budget proposal. The CCBOE has identified six (6) capital projects it is requesting to be funded and completed by the County Department of Public Works in the upcoming biennial budget cycle.

- The most important being a permanent auxiliary power source at the Hughes Building to maintain continuity of operations.
- The auxiliary power project will include modifications to the Hughes Building parking lot that in of itself needs repair for safety purposes.
- The Hughes Building carpeting is at least 30-years old and beyond its useful life.
- The Hughes Building windows are also in need of repair as several leak causing damage to the drywall and production of mold.
- The third floor in the Hughes Building should have the service counter removed to facilitate a more efficient use of the workspace.

The fourth floor in the Hughes building has several underutilized work areas that should be modified.

Dear Commissioners:

The Cuyahoga County Board of Elections (CCBOE) expresses its support for the attorney Precinct Election Official ("poll worker") program that was utilized for the November 2020 General Election. We encourage the Commission to make this initiative a permanent Continuing Legal Education ("CLE") program in the state of Ohio.

As one of the largest counties in the state, the CCBOE maintains the voting roll of over 870,000 registered voters, 975 precincts, and approximately 275 polling locations. For countywide elections, the CCBOE hires approximately 5,000 poll workers and is required to maintain political balance at all polling locations.

When conducting any election, especially one as scrutinized as the 2020 Presidential Election, deploying educated, highly skilled, and professional poll workers goes a long way towards insuring a fair, accurate and transparent election. One or two poll workers who can work under pressure, follow procedures, troubleshoot, and recognize when to ask for help can ensure an election is run smoothly. . .attorneys bring these skills to any polling location they work at.

Cuyahoga County is proud to have been the only county in the state to receive approval from the Ohio Supreme Court to offer Ohio's attorneys CLEs for participating in poll worker training for the 2020 Primary Election. The attorney training was very successful, and resulted in 44 attorneys being trained and then deployed as poll workers. CLEs were again offered for the November 2020 General Election, and the number of attorneys who participated and worked the polls increased an astonishing 690 percent, to 306 attorneys. This was a game-changer for the CCBOE, not only did this ensure enough poll workers to conduct the election during a pandemic, but it permitted the CCBOE to have at least one attorney poll worker in over 60% of polling locations.

In Cuyahoga County poll workers receive a minimum of three (3) hours of training in Cuyahoga County before each election. A new poll worker is required to attend an in-person training session,

while returning workers have the option to take our customized online interactive training course. There are numerous election laws that are covered in the CCBOE's training, including but not limited to valid voter IDs, provisional ballots, issues surrounding accessibility, curbside voting, observers, media, electioneering. . . having attorneys present in our polling locations on Election Day insures that Ohio's election laws and Directives from the Ohio Secretary of State are applied correctly.

The CCBOE received the following comment from an attorney who participated in the CLE training and then served as a poll worker during the November 2020 General Election. . .

"BRILLANT IDEA of offering continuing education credits to attorneys ...! They have the ability to learn and react quickly with the ability to think on their feet without always calling the management team. By having a positive poll working experience with these professionals, we should be in a better position for both easier and better staffing in upcoming elections. You have set the stage for the future and should award who ever came up with that idea. I believe this really paid off for us now. One young attorney said this was great way for him to "get more involved in his community" and likely to return. Can't get a better than that."

Clearly, encouraging attorneys to serve as poll workers by incentivizing them with CLE credits is a win-win for both the attorneys and most importantly our democratic process.


