VOTING IN THE MAY 7, 2019 PRIMARY ELECTION BEGINS APRIL 9th

(Cleveland) – Voters in 11 cities will decide municipal and school issues as well as three candidate contests in the May 7, 2019 Primary Election. Vote by Mail and early voting at the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections opens on April 9th.

“The Board wants to make people aware of the Election and to encourage voter participation,” said Anthony Perlatti, Director of the Board of Elections. “There are three voting options to choose from; vote by mail, early voting and voting on Election Day. Pick the one that is right for you and make your voice heard at the ballot box,” said Perlatti.

Voting by mail is an easy and convenient way of casting a ballot from the comfort and privacy of your own home. To request a ballot application visit: www.443vote.com, or call 216-443-VOTE (8683). They are also available at all public libraries.

Early voting at the Board of Elections is available for people who wish to vote in-person prior to the Election. The Board is open for early voting on the following dates:
